Bill is now in his 12<sup>th</sup> year as the primary play by play announcer for the Spurs on Fox Sports Southwest. Bill graduated from Southern Illinois University-Edwardsville, a college about 20 miles across the Mississippi River and Northeast of St. Louis, Missouri. Not surprising, his degree is in mass communications. He began his career as sport director at stations in Wisconsin and Kansas before becoming a play by play announcer for 16 sports, including football, baseball, softball, soccer, women's basketball, swimming and diving, and even synchronized trampoline. Can you imagine all the dead air-time he has had to fill during those events? In addition he has done radio play by play for several colleges, including Wichita State, Oral Roberts, and Tulsa University. He and his wife, Gayle, are the proud parents of two sons, Taylor and Cooper, both of whom play professional basketball in Australia. #### THIS DAY IN HISTORY

Immediate Past District Gov-

ernor and Founder Club Past President Lion Rod Chisholm described December 3, 1909, in our country's history. It seems that one Merkle Landis, a Treasurer of the Pennsylvania Carlisle County Bank, wanted to boost bank deposits over the year 1908. He began encouraging customers to start saving funds to improve the amounts of money they would have in 1909 to help out at Christmas for those in need. Thus was born the first "Christmas Club" for the 1909 Holiday period. This was a successful activity and it did increase the bank's deposits. It was also good public relations for the bank and the community! Christmas Club accounts are still popular in our country today.



### INTRODUCTION OF GUEST SPEAKER

Founder Club Lion Marie Senter introduced our Speaker, Asten Jones, Mental Health Specialist at Haven for Hope. Ms. Jones' topic was "The Rest of My Story - My Life As It Was and As It Is". Asten was born in San Antonio and was very open about having had a problem childhood. She was sent to live with her grandparents at age 12. After high school, she joined the military and then went to college to study Social Work. Unfortunately drugs and alcohol caused her to drop out of school. She and her mother began hitch hiking around the country. An unexpected pregnancy and the birth of a son caused her to stay clean and sober for four years. Her fiancé adopted her son to keep him out of foster care. After other problems, Asten re-contacted a case worker and asked for help. She enrolled into rehab for the last time and was introduced to the wellness clinic on campus at Haven for Hope. She received a combination of care for both her mental illness and addiction simultaneously. She reports that it was the greatest thing to ever happen to her. Today she has a full and productive life and is allowed to work on the campus that saved her life. She assists people who, like her, who are dually diagnosed.

Asten uses her story to convey to people that there is life after abuse, degradation, and hopelessness. Asten works

with two case managers on Prospect Courtyard to assist over 700 clients. She is a Peer Support Specialist, someone who has lived the life, walked the walk, and won the game of life. Her only regret is the she could not reach her Mother who lived homeless the last three years of her life, fully addicted to heroin.

Asten Jones shared the details of her problems and life style with us and the difficulties in accepting help from others to recover. She also shared her passion for helping others recover. She told us of her Grandmother's efforts to teach her Opera and even agreed to share a song with us before she ended her presentation. She has a lovely voice.

We felt honored to have visit with us! Lion President Arthur thanked Asten Jones for her time and presentation and gave her our Gift of a Texas Limestone paperweight.

Lion President Arthur conducted the Tail Twister Drawing. There was no winner today.

## Fiesta Parades - 2015 - President and Fiesta Chair Lion Ar-

thur Browne states that the Founder Lion Club Fiesta Parade Ticket Policy for 2015will remain the same as in prior years. As in the past, members may sign up for tickets during the first meeting of January. Requests of 20 or fewer tickets will be sold on the first two rows *if possible*. Requests of 21 or more will be sold on the first three rows *if possible*. As was the policy last year, money must be turned in by February 15 or sooner. Those tickets not paid for by February 15, will be released and sold to the public. The reasons for this procedure is:

- Members that turn in unsold tickets in March or April deprive the Club Office of selling tickets to the public.
- Calls come in from the public in January (and earlier) for tickets and they are told that we are sold out.
- When unsold tickets are returned by members in March or April, the Club Office must scramble to sell the unsold tickets.
- It is critical that the Club operate as efficiently as possible to obtain the maximum income potential possible since the Club has few income avenues.
- Since some members have not adhered to the policy in the past, tickets will not be dispensed until funds are received.




