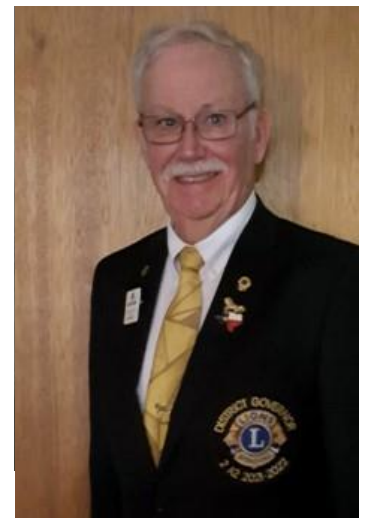

Dear Fellow Lions,

Looking at our district membership count this morning, I am happy to see that we have added 27 new members and only dropped 14. That gives us +13 in district membership for the year. Way to go Lions! DG Doug has set a goal of recruiting 63 new Lions in existing clubs, 80 new Charter Lions in 4 new Lions Clubs, and no more than 100 dropped Lions for an increase of 43 District Lions. We can do this.

Have you reported your club's service activities for July and August? So far, 7 clubs have reported July service activities on MyLion and 5 clubs have reported August service activities. Please let me know if you are having trouble accessing or reporting your club's service in MyLion. I can help and remember; you can always post previous activities in past months of the current Lions year.

Following a short business meeting you will hear about our new Lions District 2-A2 Leadership Academy. After lunch we are planning a membership workshop/roundtable discussion. Also, we will hear from some the most successful Lion recruiters in our district and their keys to success. Lions International President Douglas X. Alexander Visit

Lions Clubs International President Tours UT Health, UH Vision Centers

For almost 40 years, South and Central Texas Lions Clubs members of District 2-A2, in collaboration with Lions Clubs International, have supported basic research, clinical study, patient care and education related to human vision at UT Health San Antonio. This support has led to the establishment of several Lions named facilities that include the Lions Ophthalmic Pathology Lab, the Lions Surgical Skills Lab and a Mobile Eye Screening Unit.

On Aug. 4-5, Lions International President Douglas X. Alexander, who assumed the role in July for 2021-2022, came to San Antonio from his hometown of Brooklyn, New York, to tour these facilities, as well as two others which were the primary focus of the visit, the Lions Low Vision and Rehabilitation Center and the Lion Dr. Eugene W. Eberlin Clinical Research and Imaging Facility at the Texas Diabetes Institute (TDI) Ophthalmology Clinic. TDI is a partnership of University Health (UH) and UT Health San Antonio. It is located at UH's University Center for Community Health, 701 S. Zarzamora.

On the afternoon of Aug. 4, President Alexander and Lions Clubs members from District 2-A2 began their tour with a visit to the Eberlin Facility led by Daniel A. Johnson, MD, MBA, professor and Herbert F. Mueller Chair in Ophthalmology, and Jeong-Hyeon "John" Sohn, MD, director of the TDI Ophthalmology Clinic and the Retina Division of the Department of Ophthalmology at UT Health.

The Lions were able to see firsthand the results of the \$150,000 gift last year from the Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) to the Department of Ophthalmology that enabled the renovation of the Eberlin Facility.

The gift from LCIF allowed the renovation to include:

- An ultra-wide retinal fundus camera that increases clinicians' ability to diagnose diabetic retinopathy, the leading cause of blindness in working-age adults. The retina is the tissue lining the back of the eye that senses light and sends visual information via the optic nerve to the brain, where an image is formed.
- A unit to perform optical coherence tomography (OCT) angiography, which complements the fundus camera and makes it possible to non-invasively detect retinal blood circulation.
- An additional eye examination lane, increasing by 1,500 the number of comprehensive evaluations that can be performed annually and decreasing patient wait time.

Dr. Johnson shared that the grant allowed them to increase the number of monthly patients to 189 immediately. Now, the Eberlin Facility is experiencing a 371 a month increase. With the expansion, the TDI Ophthalmology Clinic is now able to conduct 24,500 patient visits each year.

"I really want to thank the Lions for all they have done to help us care for patients in an area where diabetes is so prevalent. So much of the retinopathy from diabetes is preventable. If

we get it early, we can prevent it from progressing. If we can get it in its more advanced stages, we can oftentimes intervene to try and reduce the loss of vision," Dr. Johnson said. "It is really devastating the toll that diabetes is taking on our patients. We see 20- and 30-year-olds that are bilaterally blind. It is an incredible burden on society. Centers like this are critical to try and to help curb this debilitating condition."

Ever since the dedication in 1991 of the Lions Low Vision and Rehabilitative Center of Texas in the Robert F. McDermott Clinical Science Building on UT Health's Greehey Academic and Research Campus, the state-of-the-art center has been providing quality low-vision rehabilitation services to people with vision loss while conducting research to create and improve low-vision rehabilitation methods and develop best-uses practice of low-vision devices. While performing this simultaneous patient care and research, the Department of Ophthalmology is educating individuals, the community as well as current and future health care professionals.

On Aug. 5, following a demonstration in the Mobile Eye Screening Unit and a visit to the Lions Ophthalmic Pathology Lab and the Lions Surgical Skills Lab, where President Alexander tried his hand at corneal surgery on a training simulator, he and the Lions then toured the Lions Low Vision and Rehabilitation Center. The Center has become well known for clinical and rehabilitation services provided to patients diagnosed with low vision, which is any chronic visual deficit that impairs everyday function and is not correctable by eyeglasses or contact lenses.

Tour participants were able to see where the low vision occupational therapist provides rehabilitation and educational services according to a treatment plan designed by a provider based on the low vision evaluation and clinical diagnosis. The center has specialized low vision certification and plays a key role in both the evaluation and rehabilitation of each patient.

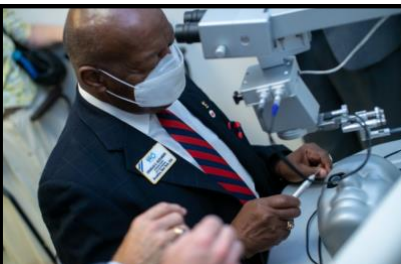
International Director Ernesto "TJ" Tijerina of the International Association of Lions Clubs acknowledged the work of President Sam E. Pantusa of the Lions Sight Research Foundation and Lion Michael "Mike" Rourke, Trustee Emeritus of the District 2-A2 Lions Sight Research Foundation, who helped over the past 38 years to create the partnership between the Lions and UT Health San Antonio.

On behalf of Lions International and UT Health, Dr. Johnson presented a plaque of appreciation to Lion Rourke and his wife, Lion Liz Rourke, explaining that no individual Lion has worked more diligently to fulfill Helen Keller's challenge to the Lions to forever serve as "Knights of the Blind."

"His decades of dedicated service as a Lion, coupled with his unequalled generosity in giving of his time, treasure and talent, have changed thousands of lives for the better. This facility, properly titled the Lions Low Vision and Rehabilitation Center of Texas, is but one of the remarkable examples of achievement in Lion Mike's lifetime of serving others," Dr. Johnson said.

President Alexander said he thoroughly enjoyed the tour of the San Antonio facilities. "It makes me proud to be a Lion. Our motto is simply to serve. We look for that opportunity to make a difference in our community. You are certainly making a difference here. You are helping people here retain their sight. This is why we do what we do," he added.

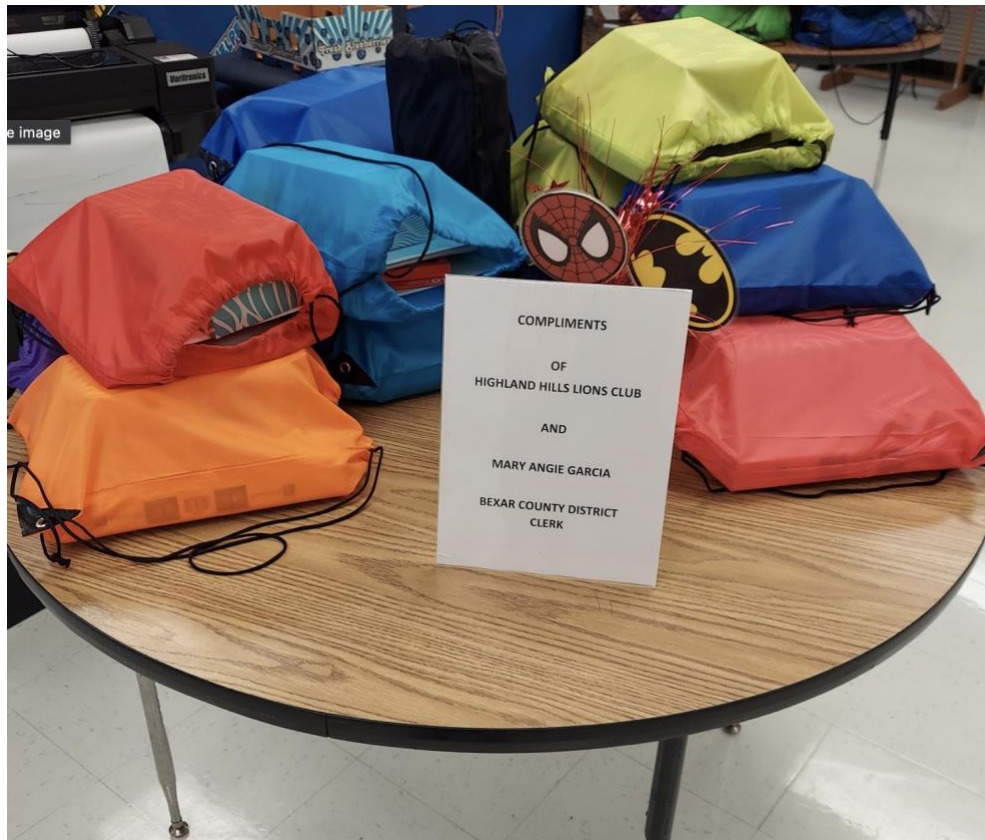
