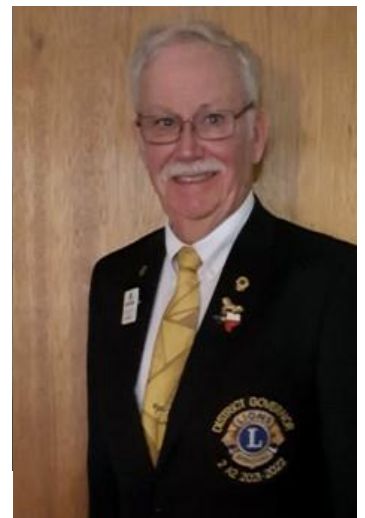

The International Convention was a little different this year, with its virtual format for meetings, training sessions, speeches and voting procedure. Lion Juanita and I were overwhelmed by the outpouring of participation and support from Texas Lions – the Multiple District with the single largest voting block!

My family was deeply touched by the welcome celebration hosted by my home District when we returned from our first official function as your International Director – the official swearing-in by International President Douglas X. Alexander.

Among my first official visits was a very special visit to my home club, the Del Rio San Felipe Lions Club. Their endorsement and support over the last three years lifted my family up and encouraged us to move forward despite the many challenges and delays along the way. I look forward to honoring my home club, District and Multiple District with my passion for Lionism and my gratitude to the Lions of Texas for the opportunity you have given me and my family.

News from Lions Clubs International

Updates from the 2021 Virtual Convention

Qualifications for District Governor – Lions Clubs International approved a change in the International Constitution regarding the qualifications for 2nd Vice District Governor – updated language includes that the candidate “has not completed a full term or major portion thereof as a District Governor.” What this means effectively, is that a Past District Governor may not serve as a candidate for Second Vice District Governor. **This change is effective beginning July 1, 2022*

Election of Executive Officers and International Directors – Lions Clubs International approved a change that provides for continuity in service by the elected Board of Directors of the Association in the event of future “government restrictions or external events prevent LCI from conducting an International Convention. Alternative procedures may be authorized by the International Board of Directors.”

LCI Board adds new Committee – Lions Clubs International approved the addition of a “Marketing Committee” among the standing committees of the International Board of Directors. This illustrates the commitment of LCI to focus on the branding of our association, projecting our message to the public and further supporting our clubs in their outreach to better serve their communities.

LCIF Campaign 100 Extended – Campaign 100 is a three-year capital fundraising campaign with the goal of raising \$300 million over the life of the Campaign, which began in 2018. The International Board



elected to extend the program for one additional year to provide clubs and members time to recover from the affects of the pandemic that challenged most clubs' fundraising programs. The goal of Campaign 100 is to provide support for major global outreach through the Empowering Service Fund, which supports all LCIF causes and the Disaster Relief Fund which is reserved for disaster relief. It is not too late for your club to join the list of "Model Clubs". Please reach out to your District LCIF Coordinator to find out how your club can become a Model Club.

Leadership Development

Since joining the International Board of Directors, I was selected to serve on the Leadership Development Committee, one of the standing committees of the International Board. This will provide a great opportunity to help shape the programs that provide quality leadership development content for our members. I will be working closely with LCI staff and Lion leaders to develop leadership training at all levels in the Association. I am especially excited about working with the team to develop and provide the training for the First Vice District Governors / DGEs at the DGE School!

Texas Lions Leadership Forum – Please consider making plans to attend the Texas Lions Leadership Forum in Austin March 19-20, 2022. This is not only a great way to meet and network with Lions around the state and explore opportunities for shared service, but also a great way to provide development opportunities for the members in your clubs. We need to keep member satisfaction and leadership development foremost in our thoughts.

Travels and Opportunities

After attending my first Board meeting, I returned to Texas to roll up my sleeves and get to work. I have attended a new club Charter Night in Cameron, Texas welcoming the Cameron Evening Lions Club to the Family of Lions. Charter Nights are one of my favorite club activities as the excitement and passion for service radiates from the faces of the new members and I am energized by their excitement. I've been honored by clubs to induct new Lions and install several new club officers.

At the close of the 1st Quarter, MD2 Texas is +99 Lions. We lost almost 1,000 Lions since July 1st, though. We need to keep our members active and engaged so we can keep our back door closed. I am confident that we will continue to grow and serve our communities, and I stand ready to assist in any way I can.

Striding for Healthy Living

MD-2 Lions of Texas invites you to participate on a virtual stride (walk, run, bike) at your leisure and place in observance of the World Diabetes Day (Nov. 14th and November as World Diabetes Month).

Due to the success of this event last year, we are continuing the virtual “Striding for Healthy Living” Program.

Many of us have taken advantage of the COVID shutdowns to walk, run or bike to get out of the house and exercise, so we are encouraging Lions to exercise during the month and to keep track of the exercise of their choice. We want to encourage and involve our communities to exercise as a means of creating healthy living, and one of the controlling factors that can reduce your risk in developing Type 2 Diabetes. This is a great way to support Diabetes Awareness and get much needed exercise during this pandemic.

From November 1 through November 30, we are asking Lions to record how far you walk, run bike or dance during the month. ***JUST DO WHAT YOU DO, BUT RECORD IT!!*** If you do it with your spouse, children, or friends, include them as well. **Lions should report their results no later than December 31 to their Lions Club Sec or Diabetes Chair**, who should collect the results and report them to your District Diabetes Awareness Chair. Let’s challenge what we have done last year!

Participating Clubs will be noted in the District Newsletter, and recognition will be given to most miles walk, run and or bike on a per-Club basis, highest average miles per participant on a per-Club basis, and highest average miles per Lion on a per-Club basis. District winners will be announced at the Mid-Winter Conference in Jan. 2022 and will automatically compete for the state. Winners for the MD2 will be announced at the Feb. CoG meeting in Kerrville, TX.

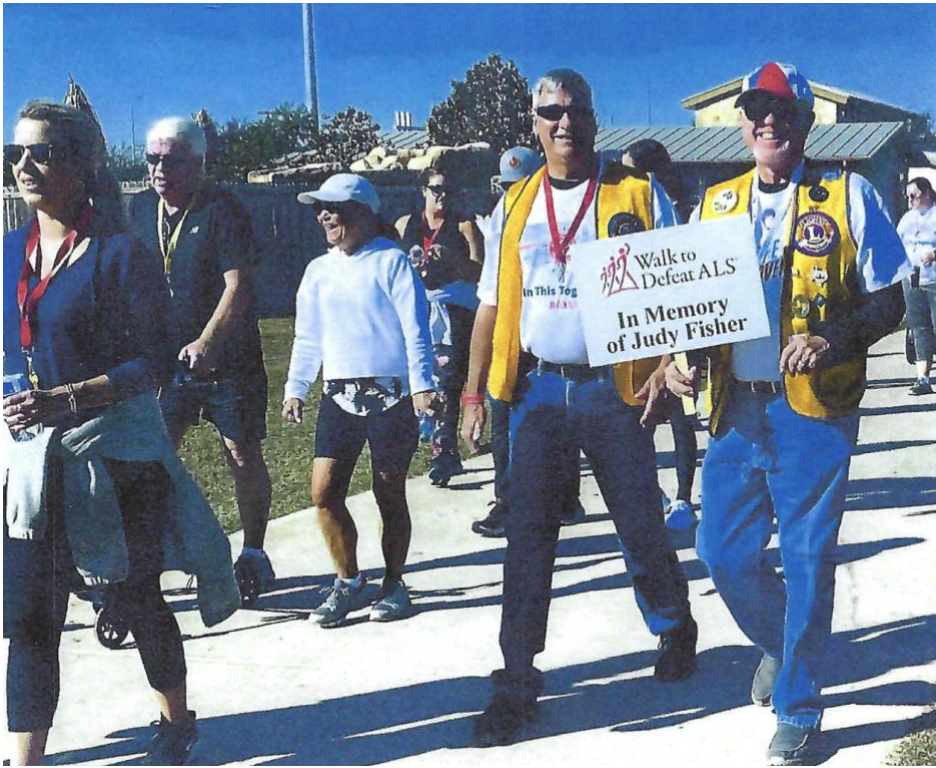
Alamo Heights and Edgewood Lions Club Donation of Shoes to UIW Lions Club

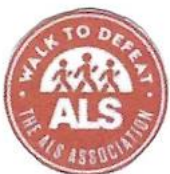
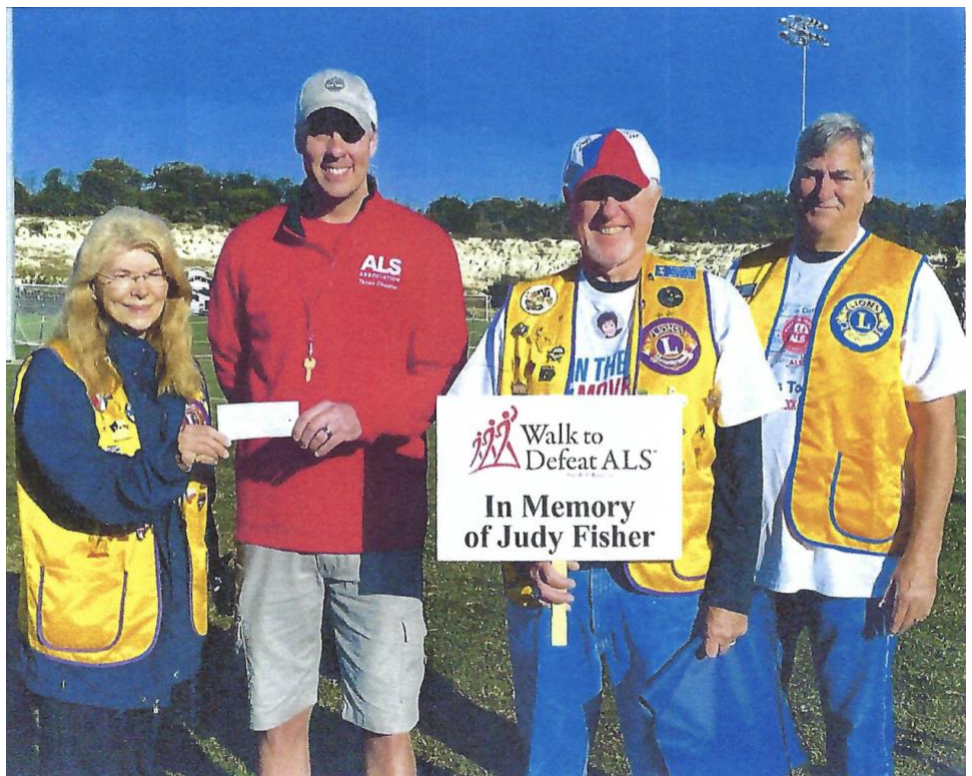
Alamo Heights Lions Club – San Antonio Walk to Defeat ALS

ANNOUNCING: THE PID M.P. MIKE BUTLER AMBASSADOR OF SERVICE AWARD

The District PDG's, once again, invite District Clubs to nominate their very special, eligible, Members to receive the PID M.P. MIKE BUTLER AMBASSADOR OF SERVICE AWARD



CRITERIA FOR NOMINATION AND SELECTION:

1. A member must have been a member in good standing for a minimum of 15 years.
2. The member may not have been inducted into the District 2-A2 Herb Petry Hall of Fame
3. The member may not have served as District Governor.
4. The member must be nominated by his/her club and voted as an awardee by a majority of PDG association members.
5. A Club may nominate one member per year using Resolution format on Club letterhead. That nomination may remain current for a three-year period. The Club may not nominate another member until the prior nominee has been awarded, three-year term has run out, or the member has expired. **Nomination is to be submitted no later than the close of the Annual Mid- Winter Conference in January.**

Other Stated Qualifications: (Enumerated, and accompanying Nomination Resolution)

- PROVEN LEADERSHIP AS A CLUB OFFICER AND CLUB PROJECT LEADER
- DEDICATED TO THE GROWTH OF THEIR CLUB THROUGH THEIR SPONSORSHIP AND GUIDING OF OTHER CLUB MEMBERS TOWARD THEIR OWN PERSONAL SUCCESS AS LIONS
- RECOGNITION FOR ETHICS ABOVE REPROACH AND AS AN INDIVIDUAL OF HIGH MORAL CHARACTER
- RECOGNIZED SERVICE BEYOND THE CLUB ENVIRONMENT THAT MAY INCLUDE MILITARY OR OTHER PUBLIC SERVICE OR LIONISTIC SERVICE BEYOND THE CLUB LEVEL

NOTE: The elements of these criteria have been endorsed by PID Butler and are based on his personal strong beliefs that District 2-A2 should always make great efforts to uplift and remember the long serving “Grass Roots” members that sacrifice and serve through their Clubs.

OTHER:

- No more than a total of four awards may be presented each year.
- The award is a handsomely designed medal with pin and ribbon and is presented with an accompanying congratulatory letter.
- The cost of the awards will be borne by the PDG Association, and the awards will be presented at the District Convention at the same ceremony as the Herb Petry Hall of Fame Induction.
