Kerrville, TX. During the Annual Board Meeting held at the Texas Lions Camp in Kerrville, Texas, the TLC Board of Directors passed the schedule for the summer of 2023. As part of the meeting, President & CEO, Stephen Mabry, discussed the successes of TLC's program, which has been aimed directly at families during the summers of 2021 and 2022. "The family unit is facing more challenges than at any other point in my lifetime" said Stephen, "and TLC's response has been commensurate to offer support and relief during the Covid-19 pandemic". Stephen elaborated, "that our mission has been simple over the past two years, **'to draw the family unit closer together, through shared experience'** and as our after-action evaluation from our participants demonstrates, we have done that with a 100% approval rating."

"Those who know me best, know me to be an 'AND' person, meaning part of my nextleveling of TLC is to go the extra mile wherever possible and offer that one more thing to inspire and delight our constituents", said Stephen. While TLC's return to residential youth camps is subject to public policy, both at home and abroad, "the Board and I fully intend to see a

return to traditional youth camps in 2023. We are planning to offer week-long, residential youth camps in 2023 for children who have physical disabilities during the month of June, type-1 diabetes for two weeks of the first half of July and family camps for the remaining two weeks of July," said Stephen.



As is TLC's long-time practice, Registration for Camp will open on January 3, 2023 through TLC's website and will continue until all sessions are full. Start making your plans today, Summer Camp 2023 is around the corner, and we are already preparing to warmly welcome your children and you home.



The Texas Lions Camp received its charter in 1949 and has a mission to provide camping experiences at no charge to children who have physical handicaps and Type 1 Diabetes with the goal of improving self-esteem. According to TLC's President & CEO, Stephen S. Mabry, "over 78,000 children have attended the camp since the Camp first began receiving children in 1953."

Located on 515 beautiful Hill Country acres, TLC's facility can be found in Kerrville, Texas, where Texas children are given the opportunity to participate in a variety of activities. Some of these activities include horsemanship, challenge course climbing, recreation & athletics, arts & crafts, music, drama, fishing, boating, archery, hiking and camping out under the stars.

Club Officers can only have a significant impact in leading their Clubs if they are knowledgeable about the functioning of their Club, if they are attuned to the traditions of their Club, if they understand the prescribed policies and procedures that have been established, and if they are able to gain the confidence and, thus, the support of their fellow Club Members.

Throughout 2022-2023, special announced training events will occur for Club Officers similar to the sessions that were held at the 1st District Cabinet Meeting on July 16. 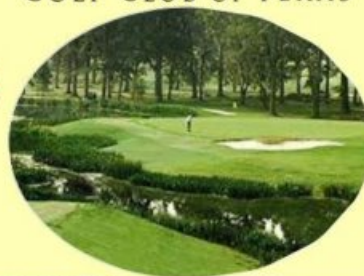

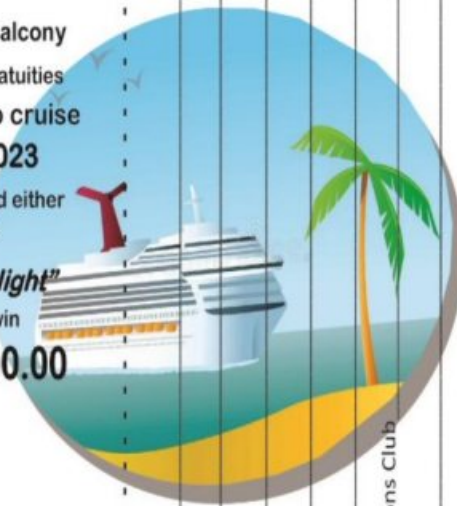
