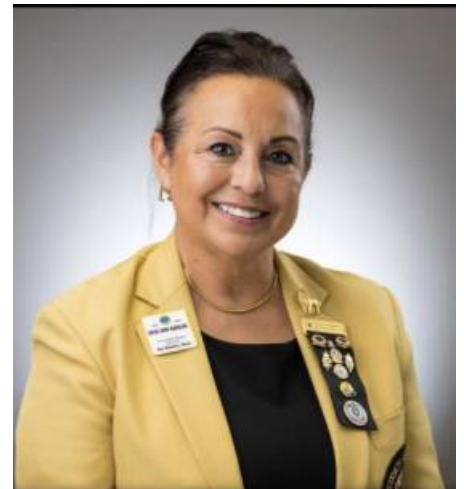

District 2-A2 Lions Convention - Certified Clubs & Delegates

Announcement: District 2-A2 Lions Convention' Certification of Club & Delegates

Attention District 2-A2 Lions Clubs! As we prepare for our upcoming District 2-A2 Lions Convention, it is essential that all clubs ensure their LCI and District dues are fully paid and that their financial balances are current.

Only certified clubs in good standing will be eligible to have delegates participate in the convention's voting process. To maintain your club's voting privileges, please verify your club's financial status before the certification deadline of April 10, 2025.

Each Chartered Club in good standing in Lions International and the District shall be represented by one or more delegates at the Annual District Convention and shall be entitled in each such Convention to **one voting delegate and one alternate for each ten members, or major fraction thereof**, of said Club as shown by the records of the International Office on the first day of the month last preceding that month during which the Convention is held. The major fraction referred to shall be five (5) or more members. Each certified delegate present in person may cast one vote only for each office to be filled and one vote only on each issue to be voted on by the members of said Convention. Unless otherwise specified herein, the affirmative vote of a majority of delegates voting on any question shall be the act of the Convention. Each Past District Governor of this District that is a member in good standing of a Club in good standing shall be entitled to be a voting delegate. Such right will not be counted as part of the number of delegates that a Club is allowed.

Your participation is crucial in shaping the future of our district, and we want every club to have a voice in this important event. If you have any questions or need assistance, please reach out to your District Cabinet Treasurer, Lion Pat Guerra or District Credentialed Chair, PDG Steve Mays.

District Membership Challenge – From Your District Global Membership Team Coordinator – PDG Steve Mays

At the first cabinet meeting on July 13th, I challenged the Lions Clubs of District 2-A2 to continue growing our membership in the 2024-2025 Lions year. Last year, our district increased its membership from 1,403 Lions to 1,426 Lions, **the first increase in net membership since 2017!**

If we can keep up the momentum and end this Lion's year with another net increase in district Lion members, I will let **three (3) lucky Lions Club members cut off my ponytail** at the 1st District Cabinet Meeting next July (I've had this ponytail since 2008 and nearly every Lion has not seen me without it). That means our membership will need to be greater than 1,426 district Lions at the end of our Lion's year on June 30, 2025.

How do you get into the drawing to cut off my ponytail?

- If your club has designated a **Club Membership Chairperson** in the new Lion Portal by July 31, 2024, your club will get **2 entries** in the drawing.
- If your club holds a **Community Membership Drive** and invites me to help, your club will get **2 entries** in the drawing.
- If your club invites me to speak at a regular scheduled club meeting, your club will get **2 entries** in the drawing.
- If your club has positive membership growth from June 30, 2024, to June 30, 2025, your club will get **5 additional entries** in the drawing.

But wait, there's more ...

- For every \$100 your club donates to the **District 2-A2 Membership Challenge**, your club will get **2 entries** in the drawing.
- For every \$25 an individual district Lion donates to the **District 2-A2 Membership Challenge**, you will get **2 entries** in the drawing.

Of all the monies raised, the first \$6,000 will go towards the **District Opportunities for Youth Scholarship Program**.

- Everything over \$6,000 will be split equally between the **LSRF**, the **Human Needs Board** and the **Children's Services Program**.

Free Postage to Mail Eyeglasses to the Texas Lions Eyeglass Recycling Center

The USPS Publication 347 dated October 2015 spells out how to mail glasses for recycling to the Texas Lions Eyeglass Recycling Center in Midland, Texas.

The publication states that individuals and noncommercial organizations which serve eligible persons (i.e., those who require glasses). No advertising is allowed.

The box or envelope must NOT be sealed. The boxes must have the words "FREE MATTER FOR THE BLIND OR THE HANDICAPPED" in the upper right corner of the address side of the envelope or parcel where postage is normally placed. The words may be printed, rubber stamped or handwritten. See the form below.

The mail is not considered a specific class of mail. If you wish to insure the item, you may pay the required insurance fee.

The Postmaster at my Post Office says they will accept boxes up to the size of a Banker's box or the size of the box that comes with 10 reams of paper. I have found the 10-ream paper box weighs about 20pounds when full of eyeglasses.

GLOBAL CAUSE OF LIONISM - VISION

Hello Lions,

Hello Lions! This month's global cause emphasizes preventing avoidable blindness and improving the quality of life for people who are blind or visually impaired. Helen Keller, who was born in 1880 in Tuscumbia, Alabama, became a powerful advocate for the blind and deaf community, speaking about their experiences and rights worldwide. She inspired us to champion this cause.

Vision Facts:

According to Global Blindness and Vision Impaired Data (2015), there are 36 million people worldwide who are blind, and 217 million people are classified as having moderate to severe visual impairment (MSVI). This means that there are 253 million people who are visually impaired in some way. There are also 1.1 billion people with near-vision impairment, because they do not have a pair of glasses.

We can make a difference in preventing avoidable blindness and impairment. Here are a few ways we can help:

- Children are visual learners. **Lions can receive training to conduct vision screening in schools.** Gloria Klasen, a member of the Del Rio Host Lions Club, has done a "remarkable" job conducting screenings at local elementary schools. She has screened over 75,000 students! Children with vision issues are referred to an eye doctor for further evaluation.
- **Eyeglass recycling.** Many Lions clubs collect used eyeglasses, which can be examined for their strength and then distributed to those in need. That helps many people with near-vision impairment.
- **Funding eye exams and glasses.** When individuals cannot afford an eye exam or glasses, Lions clubs can step in to cover the costs, ensuring they receive the eye care they need. This is a great use of funds from our various projects and can significantly improve a person's quality of life.

PDG Sam Pantusa is the President/CEO of the Lion Sight Research Foundation, which does an outstanding job promoting a continuing program of research in diseases of the eye; assists in the preservation, restoration and conservation of sight; supports the rehabilitation of the visually impaired; and encourages the dissemination of information on sight conservation and eye research.

Next month, I will write about the eighth global cause of Lionism, which is Youth. I would love to highlight your efforts related to youth service.

Sign Up, Step Up, Catch Up

For Century Club - It's "Service from the Heart"

If you aren't a member of the TLC Century Club, please "Sign Up"; if you are a member, consider "Stepping Up" to the next level; and if you were a member but dropped out, consider "Catching Up" (i.e., come back in).

What is Texas Lions Camp Century Club? It's an individual annual giving program, and as such, it is giving from your own heart, independent of Club budgets or fund raisers. It is one of the life bloods of our operating budget, that in normal times sends up to 1500 children with special needs to Texas Lions Camp each summer, and yet less than 5% of Texas Lions are members.

Who can be a Century Club Member? Anyone can be a member. You don't have to be a Lion. It can be family or friends. You can even be a non-Texan, but it is our Texas Lions who are the backbone of the Century Club.

What does it cost to be a member? You can give your gift annually, or you can give monthly. A Bronze member is \$100 (\$10 if monthly); Silver is \$250; Gold \$500; Diamond is \$1,000; & Ambassador is \$5,000. Membership automatically renews each year, so members should join with the intention of making their same gift each year or even increasing their level.

How do I enroll or Step Up? Go to www.lionscamp.com, click on "Get Involved" and go to "Donate Now". There you will find "Ways to Give". Click that open and select "Century Club". If you scroll down, you will see the option to enroll online or to download and print out the form to send to the Camp directly.

Sign Up, Step Up, Catch Up is a drive to beef up our Century Club membership for the Texas Lions Camp, as a birthday present to Texas Lions Camp on its 75th Anniversary in 2024. Today we have half the number of Texas Lions, supporting twice the number of campers at over twice the cost, as we did some 30 years ago. If we reach our goal of an increase of \$60/mo. among the members of EACH club in Texas, we will generate an additional of \$575,000 ANNUALLY, which would generate 15% of our operating budget, and help us keep serving our special children into the future.

A \$60 increase from the members of each Texas Club is doable. "Signing Up" as a new Bronze member is a \$10/mo. increase (\$100 if pd. ann.); a new Silver is \$21/mo. (\$250/yr.); a Gold is \$42/mo.(\$500); etc. Likewise, "Stepping Up" from Bronze to Silver is an \$11/mo. increase; Bronze to Gold is a \$32/mo. increase; going from Silver to Gold is a \$21/mo. increase, etc.

\$575,000/year – now that's some 75th Birthday present!

There's a saying at TLC that "ALL CAN DO". Yes, Texas Lions, \$60/mo./club. WE CAN DO IT.

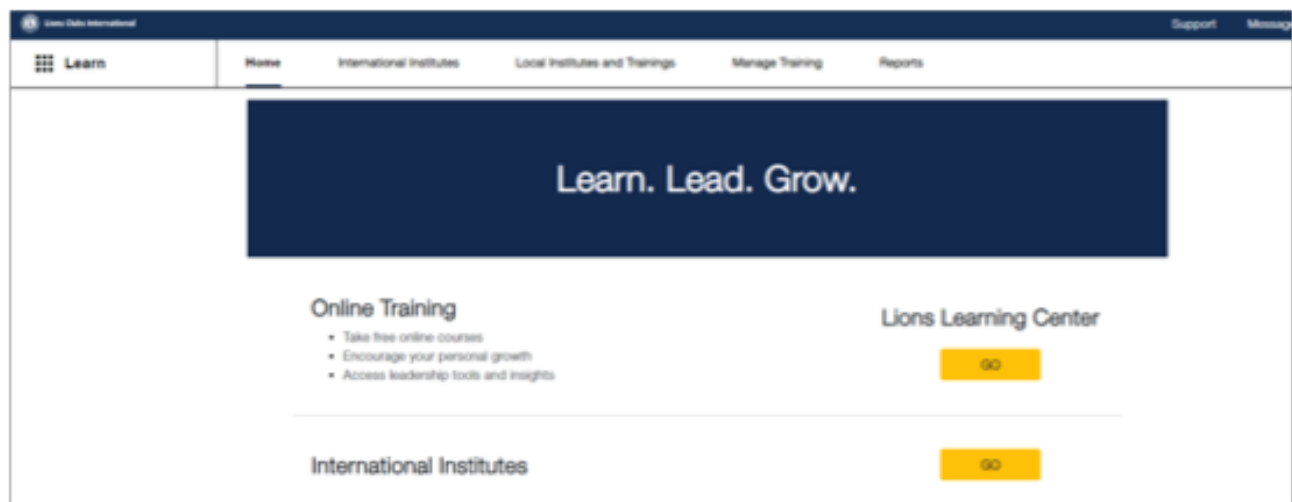
