We had a great turnout, a wonderful Friday night reception, and a record vote total on Saturday, inspiring speakers and the passing of the gavel from Governor Roberto Castillo to Governor-Elect Janie Garza.

HEALTHY LIONS CAN ENCOURAGE HEALTHY COMMUNITIES. ALONG WITH FOCUSING ON DIABETES PREVENTION THERE ARE RELATED HEALTH ISSUES THAT ARE WORTH LEARNING ABOUT. THIS MONTH I WILL HIGHLIGHT A NEWLY RELEASED INTERNATIONAL STUDY

THAT EXAMINED THE DIETS OF POPULATIONS IN 195 COUNTRIES, INCLUDING OURS, AND PROVIDES SEVERAL HELPFUL AND SOBERING SUGGESTIONS ABOUT THE KIND OF FOOD WE EAT. THIS RESEARCH STUDY WAS PUBLISHED THIS APRIL IN *THE LANCET*, AN INDEPENDENT, INTERNATIONAL WEEKLY MEDICAL JOURNAL. THE JOURNAL MAKES SCIENCE WIDELY AVAILABLE SO THAT MEDICINE CAN SERVE, AND TRANSFORM SOCIETY, AND POSITIVELY IMPACT THE LIVES OF PEOPLE. HERE'S THE ARTICLE:

Health effects of dietary risks in 195 countries, 1990–2017: A systematic analysis for the Global Burden of Disease Study 2017

Published Online April 3, 2019 [http://dx.doi.org/10.1016/S0140-6736\(19\)30041-8](http://dx.doi.org/10.1016/S0140-6736(19)30041-8)

Researchers evaluated dietary eating patterns across 195 countries to provide a comprehensive picture of the health effects of poor dietary habits. They found that:

- **Improvement of diet could potentially prevent one in every five deaths globally**
- **Dietary risks affected people regardless of age, sex, and socio-demographic development or their place of residence.**
- **Taking too much or too little of three dietary factors**
 - **whole grains**
 - **fruits, and**
 - **sodium)****accounted for more than 50% of deaths and 66% of disability-adjusted life-years (DALYs) attributable to diet.**

Research findings showed that *poor diet was responsible for more deaths than any other risks globally, including tobacco smoking*, highlighting the urgent need for improving human diet across nations. Although sodium, sugar, and fat have been the main focus of diet policy debate in the past two decades their assessment showed that **the leading dietary risk factors for mortality are diets:**

- High in sodium,

- Low in whole grains,
- Low in fruit,
- Low in nuts and seeds,
- Low in vegetables, and
- Low in omega-3 fatty acids; each accounting for more than 2% of global deaths.

The bottom line is that poor dietary habits are associated with a range of chronic diseases and can potentially be a major contributor to non-communicable disease mortality in all countries worldwide. This finding highlights the urgent need for coordinated global efforts to improve the quality of human diet. So eat more whole grains, more fruit, more nuts and seeds, more vegetables and more fish and less sodium – salt and salty foods (do I sound like your mother?).

Like exercise, good diet is beneficial to your health, and can improve the prospects for individuals with diabetes. Thanks for listening and stay healthy Lions!

MESU Screening

April 13 and 14, 2019 - Visual screening exams using the Mobile Eye Screening Unit (MESU) was conducted at the HEB on the corner of Castroville Rd and General McMullen. Seventy-eight individual were screened. Fifty-five were referred for further evaluation by an eye doctor based on the results of the screening. Screening included visual acuity exam testing both far and near vision, eye pressure screening for signs of glaucoma, and visual fields exam testing peripheral vision. Three Lions from district 2-A2 participated in the screenings. Lion Chris Lloyd from district/Kerrville Lions (8 hours participation), Lions Nick and Angie Garcia from district 2-A2 West Side Lions Club (4 hours participation each). Four UTSA students from the Unite For Sight organization participated (10 hours combined worked). UTSA students were Charlette Caldwell, Abdul Kale, Aya Hasan and George Flores. Value of the screenings to the community totaled \$3,900.00 (based on \$50 per screening). The Lions Mobile Eye Screening Unit has provided free vision screenings to over 66,000 people throughout Central and South Texas since its inception. 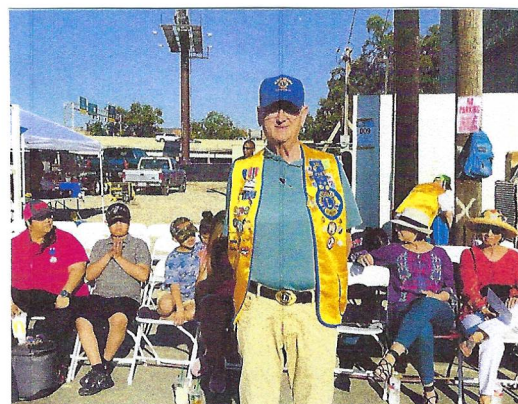
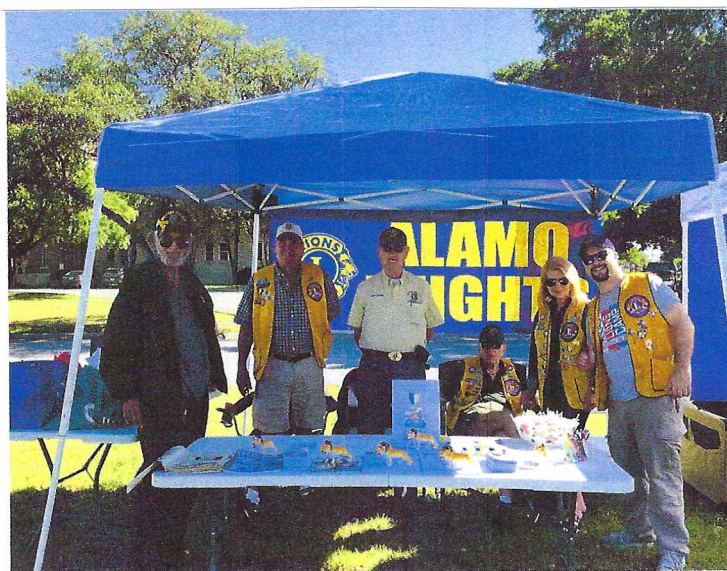
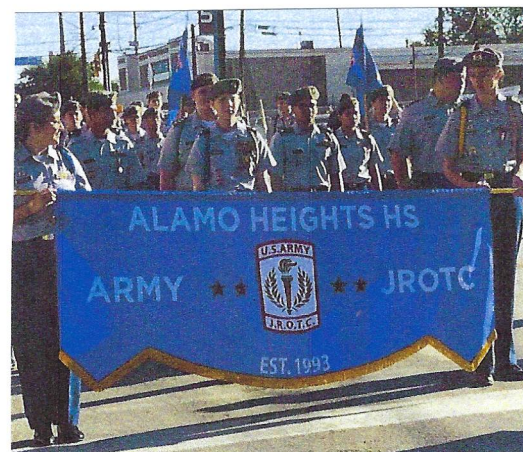

Lion Faye has spent many hours working with Lawyers, Accountants, Banks and the State Lottery Commission for our Bingo. Lion Faye takes an active part in all club projects and can always be relied on for help or advice.

From the Club President of the Alamo City Lions Club

Lion Vera McDade has been a Lion member for 16 years. She has been instrumental in overseeing our charitable giveaways and managing our Bingo. Lion Vera keeps and processes all our current information. Lion Vera is a true servant Leader.

From the Club President of the Leakey Lions Club

Lion Debbie Jackson has been a Lion member for 1 year. (might as well have been 5 years) As President of the Leakey Lions Club that has only had only a few females through the years, this year we have made a breakthrough and I owe it all to my wife, Lion Debbie. I feel guilty about nominating her but as we move forward, I can already see the impact she has made in the past and in the future with the recruitment of 5 more lady Lions. Lion Debbie has been a member for only a year but as a partner in service, she voluntarily helped the club by cooking meals for our community BINGO nights, attended every function we have sponsored at Texas Lions Camp since 2013 and has a 90% attendance rate at every event we have had locally. I was Secretary and Vice President for 3 years, President this year as well as Zone Chairman. She did all the clerical work for all of my positions including entering activities, membership, communicating under my direction and making (her idea) support booklets for my zone clubs. She has traveled to all the District meetings with me and has become inspired by the Lions' commitment to their causes. As a result, she is our only SPOT trained person, an imitative she took on her own. With our club she has accompanied us to our rural areas to test 1500 children for vision screenings. It was Lion Debbie's idea to join our local food pantry distributing group. Now it is a monthly volunteer event which our Lions have pick up to assist. This had encouraged another member to start a "Assist the local park" in their attempts to clean up ball fields for youth and take up collections for uniforms for those who could not afford it. Our secretary for 2018-19, whom Lion Debbie had trained, had to many work hours so she resigned her position as club secretary, giving Lion Debbie the opportunity to complete this position for the rest of the year. Lion Debbie has brought in a fellowship session before meetings, a membership imitative for attendance as well as her ideas for the future, including a Leo Club, bringing the MESU to a multi-area, a fundraiser involving a 5K walk/run and an event involving the motorcyclists that frequent our area. 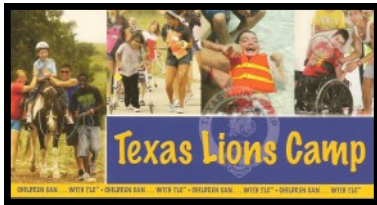
From the Club President of the San Antonio First Ladies Lions Club

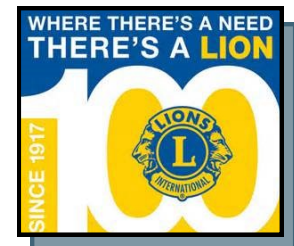

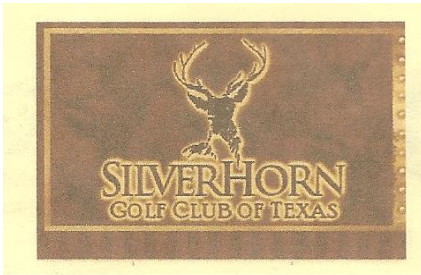

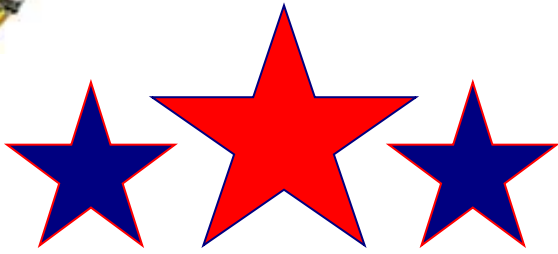

Elizabeth has attended TLC for the past 4 summers and talks about camp affectionately as “the best place on earth”. For Elizabeth, TLC is a camp for kids with special abilities just like her. She can do anything there, try new things, do everything other kids can do and have tons of fun while doing it.

Elizabeth loves school, especially reading, math and science. But helping others is really her favorite thing to do. At school, sometimes Elizabeth needs help traveling from one class to another. The students who help her, in turn she tutors them in whatever subjects they are having trouble. Outside of school she volunteers and raises resources and awareness for those in need. Her mother Michelle describes Elizabeth as the hardest working, most loving and kind, generous and thankful kid she knows.



Her mother, Michelle, tells of Elizabeth’s conditions, periventricular leukomalacia (PVL) and CP with spastic quadriplegia and how they do not define her daughter and her abilities. She said, “Elizabeth had a rough start to life. Born at 29 weeks and with complications at birth, she’s endured multiple surgeries and procedures throughout the twelve short years of her life. Lots of people rush through life, but not her. She enjoys life each day and takes time to smell the flowers. No matter what she has been through physically, surgeries, or therapy, she just keeps going. Even in times of struggle or pain, she still looks for ways to help others around her that are in need.



“TLC was amazing and perfect for Elizabeth from the very start. She loves riding the horses and going down the zip-line. But this past summer, she fell in love with Camp Scene Investigation (CSI). The mock crimes around campus gave her and her group opportunities to solve problems and work together to solve the crime. She loved every minute of it. She always feels included at TLC and things are adapted, and modified for her to participate. The support staff make the impossible possible and those international staff cause Elizabeth to speak in an English Accent all the time, even long after she goes home.
