Lions Are Knights of the Blind.

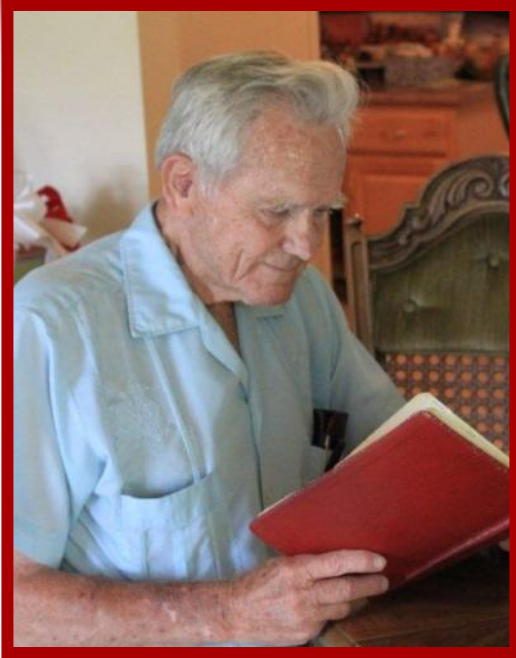
Can a Knight of the Blind ignore the challenge we accepted from Helen Keller all those years ago?

It would also be a good practice if you would start immediately to accumulate information on the member you have lost. Time is famous for losing information so the sooner you start gathering information the more you are apt to find; especially when trying to locate photos of the deceased one. Believe the admonition of one with 84 years of experience.

[The actions and works of Lions who have left us for their eternal rewards reminds me of events in my

younger days. As long as I could remember, Dad always had an apiary, sometimes with as many as 30-40 bee hives. So many times as a lad or teenager I would help him with what we called "rob the bees." i.e., taking off honey bees had made during good plant blossom periods when flowers were rich with pollen. We would take out frames from the 'supers', place them in an extractor and by centrifugal force remove the honey.

When placed in a jar the honey would often be stored for years in our Honey House without the honey losing its flavor, sweetness, or benefits. The work of a good Lion who has served his Master and mankind well should be honored and remembered forever for his dedication to our motto - We Serve. His flavor, sweetness, and benefits will last forever.]

We still suffer from the severe drought, and the disastrous fires seem unbelievable. The other day I heard a newscaster say that there were over 170 fires burning in Texas. After driving highway 21 for almost 40 years going to and from Aggieland, I personally will miss that beautiful forest area outside of Bastrop. 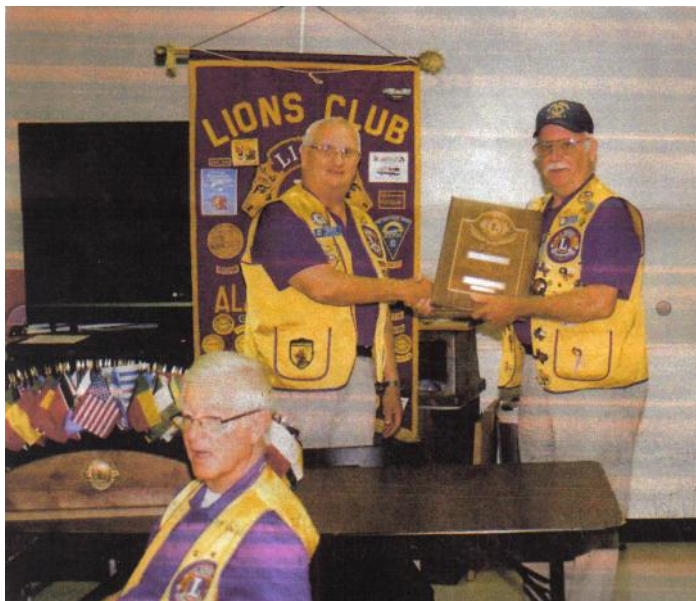
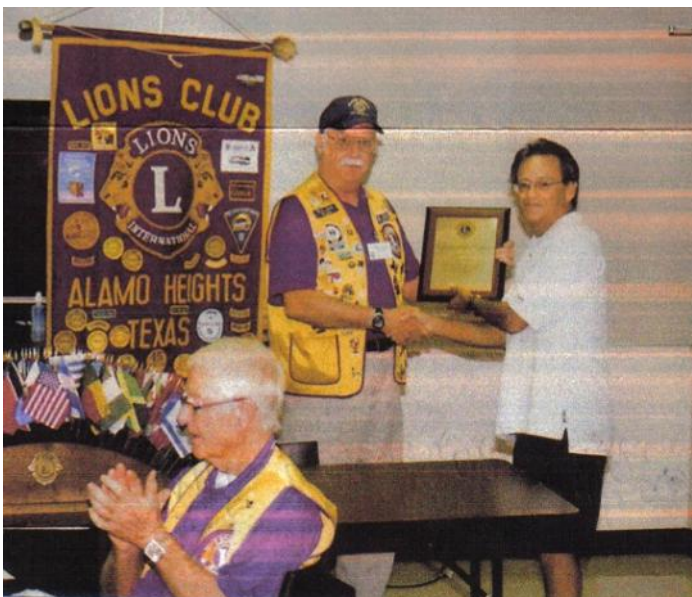

From TLERC: People in Lorenzo Need Glasses Too!

Texas is a huge land mass with thousands of cities, towns, villages, and some small specks on the map, which only show up because there is a Post Office. Most Texans have never heard of Pandale, Cornudas, Twitty, or Lawn. They have no idea how to get to Bruni, Edcouch, Vashti, or Lorenzo; and don't bother to ask for information about Danevang, Kiomatia, Iredell, or Fred. In Lionism, as in other endeavors, we tend to concentrate where there are large groups of people in need (i.e. large cities) and several Lions Clubs to share the work and costs. Many times the little ones go unnoticed.

There are hundreds of hidden little towns just like those above and as the Lions of 2-T2 recently found out, **people in Lorenzo need glasses too!** Maybe it was because the people of Lorenzo kept showing up for help at the eye screenings routinely held by the Lions Clubs in Lubbock, or maybe the Lorenzo Lions saw what a great service the Lions were offering in Lubbock.

Whatever the reason, the Lorenzo Lions held their first eye screening and clinic on 9/24 at the Lorenzo High School gym. Lions from Lubbock under the direction of 2T2's TLERC Director, PID Marshall

Cooper, brought the screening lane equipment. Lion Tom Mills, an optician from Big Spring and TLERC's optical lab director, came to help fit glasses on adults. Lions from Midland Downtown brought Pedia Vision to screen the children.



Dave Hoopman, TLERC's COO, brought the mobile exam room along with several thousand pair of glasses. Lion Dr. Norman Gould came to examine the children.

A couple of dozen adults were fitted with recycled glasses and 9 children will be receiving new glasses as a result of this joint effort. It was a successful day and the Lorenzo Lions found out that being part of an International Organization means having "shovel ready" projects available. It means being part of a team (Lions from their own District, as well as 2-A1) and it means access to several Multiple District 2 State

programs (in this case the Texas Lions Eyeglass Recycling Center) that they can use "to serve" their community.

It was also an important day for the Lorenzo Lions, because now they see the opportunity to partner with two other nearby small town Lions Clubs to start a regular screening for their area. They learned that if they buy just a little bit of equipment and take the TLERC training class, they can go out on their own to help eliminate preventable blindness in another small corner of Texas.

What are you doing to answer the call of Sight First: to eliminate preventable blindness around the world? Are you putting glasses on your local children for \$14/pair? Are you doing regular eye screenings in your communities? Do you have PediaVision yet? If you haven't started or if you need help with your existing programs, call your TLERC Director or call TLERC's offices. **It's just possible that the people in Twitty, or Kiomatia, Pandale, Bruni, Iredell, or Fred.need glasses too!**

Down Syndrome Camp Comes to TLC

For decades, when asked if children who have Down syndrome qualified to attend Texas Lions Camp, the answer was always disappointingly, "No." This past summer, TLC opened a pilot program to test how Lions might provide services to this special population of children and families and turn that "No" into a "Yes." And, on July 17, 2011, we did so for the very first time in our history.

As planning began to facilitate this exciting, first step, many methods of accomplishing the goal were entertained and there were many issues to be addressed. Should children with Down syndrome be mainstreamed into the general sessions? Should the age groups for this camp be the same or more restrictive than the norm? Should the session be offered during summer or at another time period? If offered their own session, how many children should be allowed to register?

Ultimately, our plan included inviting 75 children between the ages of 7-16 to attend a one-week session programmed specifically for their care needs. The session ran concurrently at TLC in conjunction with the Texas Burn Survivor's Camp, though the two groups were com-

pletely autonomous and assigned separate areas of Camp so that they did not over-lap.

So What Did We Learn?

It is a wonderful and terrifying experience to take a confident step into the unknown...and there were a number of unknowns as 75 children and their families arrived for check-in. Some of the things that became immediately apparent included, but were not limited to the following:

Definitely, the decision to offer a specific session (rather than mainstreaming into the regular sessions) served the children well in the Texas Lions Camp setting

The 75 slots allotted for the Camp did not create a small camp...but a VERY-LARGE-CAMP

With a group of this size, the age limits should be shifted upwards to allow younger children the additional time to develop the skills needed to be away from home (and Mom)

Programmatically, our standard format and schedule needed to be altered in order to provide one of the things this population needs the most: Routine... Routine... Routine.

Behavior, rather than age, is more of a critical factor for this population to thrive in TLC's setting

The parents/families of this population were very appreciative of the Lions and staff and were a privilege to work with

So What About 2012?

After observing the week, I met

with the entire TLC seasonal staff who worked hands on with the kids in order to debrief and request their input for the future. Who better to answer the question, "Is TLC's offerings in the best interest of these kiddos?" Honestly...I didn't know what the final outcome would be as the week was a significant departure from our norm, but I expected there could be mixed reviews as to whether or not the program should be adopted in 2012.

To the credit of these young men and women who had just expended every last ounce of energy...there was not a single dissenting vote or negative comment about repeating the program. When asked specifically if they would recommend the program to continue, ~130 hands went enthusiastically skyward with zero stating they wouldn't enjoy working with these kids again.

This past August, it was my privilege to make a full report to the Board of Directors along with a recommendation to include the Down Syndrome Camp in the schedule for 2012. The Board adopted the proposal and excitedly...we are now making preparations for a repeat program next summer.

What to Expect in 2012

Camp for children who have Down syndrome will be offered on July 15-21, 2012

The ages for the program will be shifted upwards to include ages 12-16

The program will include up to 75 children

The 2012 application will seek additional information about behavioral patterns and care needs of campers.

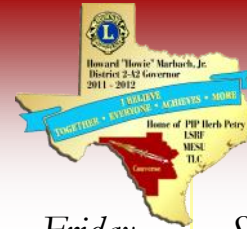
