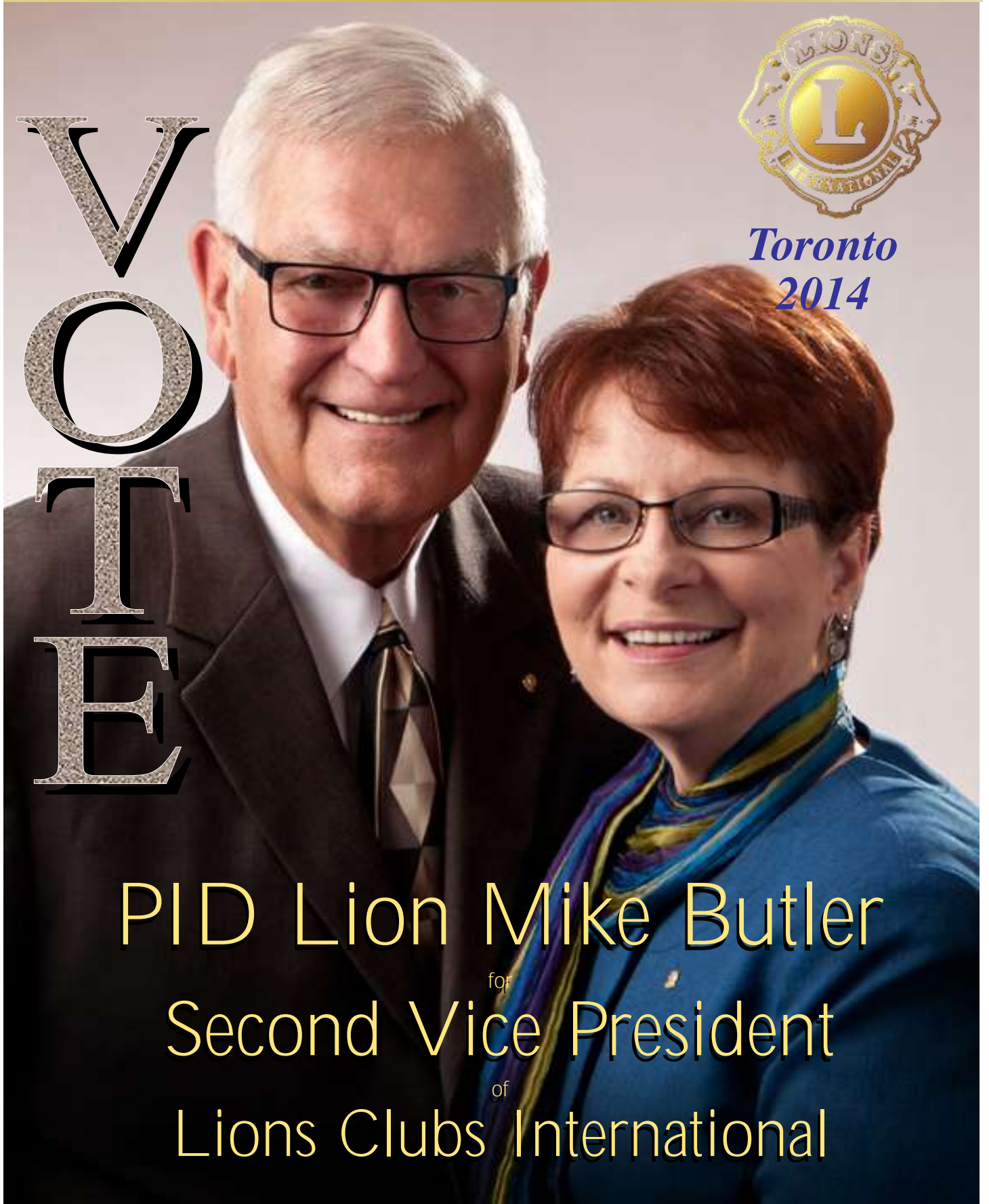

Utopia Lions

The Utopia Lions Club would like to introduce you to a gentleman in the Sabinal Canyon who has made a difference in the lives of others. Sid Chaney was born on February 11, 1945, in Utopia, attended Utopia Schools, and has spent the majority of his life in the Sabinal Canyon.



Chaney attended Southwest Texas Junior College and Texas A&I University, majoring in draft evasion. However, when that didn't work out, he was drafted into the Army on December 12, 1966. He served until December 11, 1968 and served in the RSVN July 21, 1967 until July 20, 1968. Chaney remarked that since 1968 was Leap Year, he served an extra day. After his stint in the Army, he attended Surveying school at TSTI, Waco, and graduated May, 1978. Upon graduation, Chaney worked for Chapman-Garrett Engineering in Uvalde and Edward Garret and Associates, also in Uvalde. He married the love of his life, Jacque O'Bryant, on May 1, 1982. He passed his surveying exam in 1985 and has had Chaney Surveying Company since then. He has also attended Utopia United Methodist Church fairly regularly.

In 1984, Chaney joined the Utopia Lions Club. He has been a Director several times. He has also headed the trash pick-up for several years. Sid and Jacque have been in charge of the Ice Cream Crank-Off for many years, usually held in February right around Valentine's Day. Chaney was named Lion of the Year the first year that award was given.

Chaney recollects coming home from a

Little League game, held in Knippa in 1956. He was amazed that Utopia had street lights on for the first time, and he thinks there were five lights. He also remembers the Lions Club buying baseball uniforms for the teams which, up until then, had been shirts and jeans. Chaney said that through Lions Club, "Jacque and I made many friends." They have also enjoyed showing their beagles when they were active in that.

Thanks, Lion Sid Chaney, for your dedication and service to the Sabinal Canyon for thirty years.

The Utopia Lions Club would like to introduce you to a gentleman in the Sa-



binal Canyon who has made a difference in the lives of others. Kent Kepler was born on March 10, 1937, in Oshkosh, Nebraska. He spent his early years in Big Springs, Nebraska, where he attended a school very much like Utopia having around 80 students in the high school pulled in from four surrounding counties.

Kepler attended Stanford University and admits it was a culture shock. He spent two years in Los Angeles area serving as a missionary. He attended seminary in Claremont, California, graduating in 1984. The next year, he married Virginia, his lifelong bride, and served two years as campus minister at the University of Minnesota where he received an MA in English from the University of Minnesota grad school. They moved to Austin, Texas, where Kepler attended the University of Texas, spending five years in grad school. He taught at Southwestern University in Georgetown, Texas. Kepler decided to go back into

the ministry. Since that time, he has spent many years in Texas as a minister, beginning in the Del Rio/Brackettville area, two and one-half years in Hebronville/Bruni/Mirando City, and one and one-half years in Odem. He served in Bishop for five years, Sonora for five years, Menard/Eden four years, San Saba for two years, three years in Big Lake/Barnhart, and served three years in Utopia. He retired from the ministry in 2003. He has two children: Cynthia, born in 1971, and Catherine in 1973. Cynthia attended Stanford University and Duke Divinity, and now serves as a Methodist pastor in Austin. Catherine, attended Nebraska Wesleyan, and teaches in Brackettville. His wife, Virginia, taught many years and retired in 2000.

Lion Kepler joined the Hebronville Lions Club in 1977, but it folded after one meeting. While living in Odem, he served as secretary/treasurer of the Odem Lions Club from 1979 through 1981. Kepler was a member of the Bishop Lions Club from 1981 through 1986, serving as the president of that club in 1986. While living in Big Lake, Kepler was a member of the Big Lake Lions Club from 1997 until 2001. Since moving to Utopia, he has been in the Utopia Lions Club since 2000 and has served as second vice-president, first vice-president, and president. An important moment in Lion Kepler's Lions Club career was sending a man to Michigan to receive a guide dog.

Kepler recalls being a big, bruising 135 pound center on the football team. He also attended Boys State after his junior year in high school. He also worked in church camps in Kentucky (1952) and Alaska (1958). He was in Alaska when it became a state. Kepler recalls a special memory when, at his retirement in 2003, he passed the mantle of clergy office to his daughter, Cynthia. He stated there wasn't a dry eye in the place.

Thanks, Lion Kent Kepler, for your dedication to Lions Club and for more than thirty years of service.
