## re-MEMBER Texas - Perception is Reality

To most people perception is reality. It doesn't matter what's behind the façade. What they believe they see **IS** the truth to them. So it becomes important to make sure what they see is pleasant and inviting. Last month we started discussing the 1<sup>st</sup> part of the 3<sup>rd</sup> "R" in our "re-Member Texas" program – **rebuild**.

For those who have not been keeping up, **re-MEMBER Texas** is **our** Texas membership plan for 2015-16. The plan is built around three main tenets: **Recruit, Retain, & Rebuild**. The **re-Member Texas kit** contains two important pieces in it to help you with your recruiting plan: The **re-Member Texas News**, a 14 page newspaper full of ideas & several guides for your club to help in the process. If you don't have one, the **re-Member Texas News** can also be found on the Texas website [www.texaslions.org](http://www.texaslions.org).

This month we will tackle the 2<sup>nd</sup> prong of **Rebuild**: the "Façade". The façade is what people see that makes them decide if they want to enter the building, which is half the battle; of course, as we discussed last time, they won't stay long if the infrastructure inside is not sound. We need to rebuild that first.

Over the last 30 years we Lions have done a poor job of promoting ourselves. When I joined in the '70's, everyone knew who we were. Today a very large percent of people I talk to have no clue. It's time to polish up the façade and make ourselves more visible and attractive.

Part of that goes back to the sound "foundation". In other words, making sure that the projects we do are relevant to the needs of our community today. More importantly, we have to realize that we, the Lions, are the façade of Lionism. So it is critical that we are seen out in public with our hats and vests/t-shirts, not only raising money, but more importantly, doing what Lions do – **SERVING!**

For too long now, many of our clubs have raised money and then sent that money to non-Lion charities, while doing **NO visible service**. When we do that it's those other charities that are recognized. No wonder people have forgotten (or in the case of our younger generations – don't know) who we are.

So to spruce up the facade of your club to attract people to join and stay, you need to be seen visibly servicing in projects that are relevant to the community. Just as important, however, is PR. A modern successful club will spend some time developing a PR committee that will constantly get the club's name on air and in print. If the external façade is one of action, service to the community, and fun, **then the reality becomes the perception** and will attract people to your club.

The **re-Member Texas News** is full of ideas about how to build a PR program. LCI's website offer loads of press release templates for you to use and the Texas website offers several different full color posters (in English and Spanish) developed by our State PR Chairman, DG Orlando Rodriguez from T3. These posters can be personalized to your club and then reproduced to post in your community. Take a look. **Get noticed!**

Whether or not you need to work on the infrastructure, the facade or both, the process of **rebuilding** your club will make you more attractive to new people, who are the future of our clubs; and once they join it will make them want to stay.

## District 2-A2 Mid-Winter Conference Floresville - January 15-16, 2016



The Floresville Lions Club hosted the District 2-A2 Mid-Winter Conference on January 15-16, 2016. The meeting started with the presenting the colors. The pledge was lead by 2nd VDG Don Kirchhoff. District Chaplain, PDG Rod Chisholm led the Lions in song.

Lion LaJuana Newnam-Leus, Floresville Lions President, welcomed the Lions to Floresville.

The Leos adjourned to their meeting area.



Lion Shelly Chance, District Secretary, presented the minutes from the previous Cabinet meetings. Lion Bethann Rakowitz, District Treasurer, presented the District Treasurer's Report.



Lion Chris Condren presented the GLT report. She said training is available on the LCI website. She is developing plans with 1<sup>st</sup> VDG Joh Lee and 2<sup>nd</sup> VDG Don Kirchhoff for the next year.



Lion Wes Dorman, Chairman of the LSRF, reported that they are making progress on the LSRF website and are looking forward to an exciting evening celebrating the San Antonio Spurs on April 9<sup>th</sup>.



1<sup>st</sup> VDG John Lee talked about Stride for Sight. The goal this year is \$30,000 which pays for Pedia Vision, enables the purchase of one in the MESU. In addition, some new equipment for the MESU will allow the screening of people who are subject to diabetic retinopathy. The 5K run will be in Helotes on March 19<sup>th</sup> (starting at 8:30 AM). An additional race this year is "Pooch & Partner", as well as the wheelchair and kids races. Lion John is asking all clubs to form teams. Awards for largest team and award for largest sponsorship will be given.

Lion Marilyn Weed showed the Peace Poster which was submitted by the LaVernia Lions club. A check for \$250 was received by Lion MayAnn Mays to be given to the winner, Levi Grace Martinez.



Lion Ken Book, Youth Contest Chair, spoke of the Opportunities for Youth available through Lions Clubs. The contest coordinators are: Outstanding Youth – Lion Leslie Herrera, Diabetic Essay – Lion Janie Garza, Young Women's Scholarship Pageant – Lion Mary Ann Mays, and Drug Awareness Speech – Lion Abel Martinez. Lion Ken also mentioned that individual clubs can sponsor a scholarship.



Lion Ken is also the Human Needs Chairman. He reported a bank balance of \$13,836.58. Three requests were received: Northside Lions, Converse Lions and the Region 20 Lions which is in progress.

Lion President Doug from the Guide Dogs of Texas Lions Club spoke about the training of the dogs. A dog is trained in a person's home and a lifetime relationship with the dog is established. They monitor the dogs through the dog's life. The dogs retire after about 10 years of service. Dogs are trained in many environments including prisons. Recidivism is less than 27% for prisoners who are in the dog training programs. There are training instructors around the state. It takes about \$50,000 to train a dog and the client who receives the dog only pays \$1.00. President Doug said they are available for presentations to Lions Clubs and a special trip to view the facilities and process can be arranged.



PCC Mike Rourke spoke of the PDG Sam Lindsey campaign for International Director. There were pins available to support PDG Sam in his campaign.

PCC Mike also presented IPDG Sam Pantusa with the LCI Governor Excellence Award.



IPDG Sam Pantusa presented the Club Excellence Awards to several clubs. Lion LaJuana received the District Zone Chair award and the International President Medal .



District 2-A2 Co-Director Lion Allie Thomas spoke on the Texas Lions Camp. Gift of every size are needed to touch the lives of children and their families. This year is the 60<sup>th</sup> Anniversary for the camp. Donations can be designated as: Bronze - \$100, Silver - \$250, Gold - \$500, Diamond - \$1,000, or Ambassador - \$5,000. Lion Liz Rourke spoke of the International Convention and the USA/Canada Forum. The International Convention will be in Japan this year on June 24-28. The USA/Canada Forum will be in Omaha, Nebraska on September 15-16.



PDG John Cole spoke on the 2016 District 2-A2 Convention which will be held in Del Rio at the Ramada Inn. The room rate for the convention will be \$79.00. Friday agenda includes the Youth Contests, registration, and a trip to the Kickapoo Casino in the evening. Saturday will be the business meeting, a winery tour, and the banquet in the evening. Pre-registration for the convention is \$55.00. After April 15<sup>th</sup>. Reistration will e \$66.00. Reservations may be made at the Ramada by calling 830-775-1511.

Lion Janie Garza reported that there have been 28 eye screenings, using the SPOT machine and charts, in 9 weeks. 3,525 children were tested and 476 were determined to need further examinations. In order to do screening, Lions need to be SPOT certified.





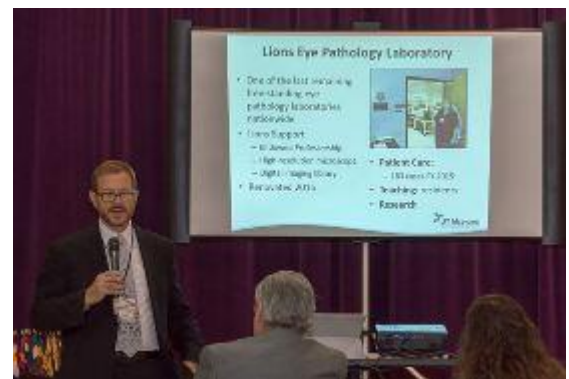
PDG John Seale reported on the Texas Lions Foundation. District 2-A2 is in the bottom quarter of the districts. District 2-A2 over the years has contributed \$244,000, had the most TLF awards, the largest number of Texas Lions Fellows, and 100% paid up cornerstones. There are three clubs who have led for 2 consecutive years, we are one of the three. If we lead this year, we will be the only club which has led for two consecutive years three times. PDG John will be retiring from the TLF this year. He urged all the clubs to send all their pledges and donations in.

PDG Rod Chisholm reported on the GMT activities. This year it is time to “Re-Member”. One way is to form new clubs from old clubs. He urged clubs to talk about membership at each meeting. The goal for this year is 1 new member each month.



Leo Nicole Miller from the Stockdale Club reported on the Leos meeting. The Leos are conducting a food drive until February 29<sup>th</sup>. They also volunteer at the Texas Lions Camp Relay for Life.

Lion Wes Dorman, Chairman of the LSRF introduced speaker Dr. Daniel A. Johnson, Professor and Chair of the Department of Ophthalmology of UTHSC, San Antonio, who spoke about the many ways Lions participate in eye programs. Dr. Johnson spoke of the Low Vision Center which handled 1000 patients last year. There are two labs, Surgical Skills Lab and the Eye Pathology Lab, in Texas which handled 183 cases last year. A lot of research is done through these labs. Lots of specialized training is provided such as shaken baby injuries and rare disorders. There are only 5 or 6 eye pathologists in the US. Regular pathologists do not have the training for problems of the eyes. The Eberlin Center studies the effect of genes on the eyes. Lions support the Mobile Eye Screening Unit (MESU). The UT Health Science Center has an impressive residency program. Only 4 out of 400 applications are accepted every year and they also train military eye personnel. District 2-A2 Lions support the programs usually on a multi-district or state level.



There was a silent auction and Taittwisters distributed a number of door prizes to the Lions. PDG John Kimrrough, District Chaplain, gave the Benediction and the meeting was closed with “ ‘til we met again”. The Floresville Lions hosted an excellent cabinet meeting which was enjoyed by all.





## Texas Lions Foundation



Fellow Lions,

I wish I could tell you that everything is rosy at the Texas Lions Foundation, but I can't. We are where we have been the last couple of years at mid-winter. District 2A2 right now still ranks in the bottom quarter of our sixteen districts. Yet two years ago, we rallied and ended up in second place and last year we ended up in the number one spot. That's four times we have been in the number one spot in the past eight years.

Let me give you a little more info about how 2A2 rates among the districts. District 2A2 ranks number one in total amount of donations since the Foundation was started. We also lead in total number of Texas Lions Foundation awards and in total number of Texas Lions Fellows. In the Conerstone Club category, 2A2

has more 100% paid up members than any other district. Now you can see why I say "You make me proud to be a Lion".

Let me tell you about an award the Texas Lions Foundation has for exceptional service. This award is given to a district which leads in donations for two consecutive years. Since the founding of the Foundation, only three districts have ever won this award and 2A2 is one of the three. If we do that, I don't think another district can match or best our record in the next forty or fifty years. I want to see us win that award. In the past, I have tried to be impartial but this year I WANT IT!

You see, I have been on the Board of the Foundation for the past nine consecutive years and that is a long time to be on any Lions board. So I have asked 1<sup>st</sup> Vice District Governor John Lee to find someone else to be your Trustee. I have enjoyed my work with the Founhdation and I thank you for allowing me to serve both you and our fellow Texans.

## Texas Lions State Convention – *ACTION Projects Registration*

What is Texas Brand of Lionism? First of all, the 2015-16 Council of Governors thinks it means Texas –sized service! Secondly, Texas Brand of Lionism also means the leaders of Texas Lionism should make our Convention more meaningful to grassroots Lions and providing avenues of education & experience for those who have no current interest in the business & committee meetings. Combining the two, the 2016 State Convention in Midland will contain 3 Action Projects, giving club leaders, committee chairs, and club members the chance to learn new ways to serve with hands on experience allowing them to go back to their communities and put these new projects into ACTION.

For complete information on the 3 Action projects and how they may benefit your club or zone, go to the Texas Lions website ([www.texaslions.org](http://www.texaslions.org)) and read the "MD2 Convention Times (pages 4-6). This newspaper will be found under the Midland Convention tab/button. To register you will need to complete the information below and send it to the person indicated for the selected project. It will not be possible for one Lion to participate in more than one project, thus you may want to split up the courses between others in your club or zone, so you can share ideas when you get home.

***Texas Ramp Project***  
Learn how to build an ADA compliant handicapped ramp for the elderly or disabled, who may be trapped in their homes without one. Using the system and building templates (that can be used for any configuration) of the Texas Ramp Project, you will learn how to take a "pre-vetted" lead in your town, develop a site plan, and then actually build a ramp. The classroom seminar starts Thursday (1 PM) at the hotel. The crew will pre-build and then assemble a ramp on location throughout Friday & Saturday with time allotted to attend the meals and hear the special speakers. Bring work clothes. ***TLERC Used Eyeglass Training Course***  
Learn how to set up and operate a screening lane to place recycled eyeglasses on those in need. Using the Texas Lions Eyeglass Recycling Centers' own training course (now used by centers all over the world), the class will learn how to use all of the equipment and then how to find a "near prescription" for the client. All training will be at TLERC in Midland (2550 Flynt) only 5 minutes from the convention hotel. Your class will start Thursday (9AM), will continue on Friday, & culminate Saturday where you will participate in an actual screening & placement. Time will be allotted to attend the meals and hear the special speakers. ***Children Vision Screening – "Lions kidsight USA"***  
Learn how to set up & hold a children's vision screening, including the use of both the "Plus Optix" & "Spot" machines. Manufacturer Reps from both companies will also provide "manufacturer certification classes" (needed to screen in Texas schools). The group will start with a classroom training session on Thursday (1 PM) at the hotel. On Friday you will go to some daycare centers for actual hands on experience screening children.
