Do the math....if the 1st Lions Convention was held in Texas in 1917 (and assuming we have had a Texas Convention every year since) the State Convention in Midland from **May 19th to 21st** will be **Texas' 100th Convention**. We certainly aren't trying to steal any thunder from the **big 100th Birthday celebration in 2017**, but this year's convention is what launches us into our 100th year of Lionism (2016-17), leading up to that big bash! However, what your Council of Governors is hoping to do, through the efforts of the 2A1 Lions, is to provide a Convention for **ALL** Lions. **This convention is for you, the Club Leadership, Committee Chairs, and Club members**, who want to learn about what Lionism in our 2nd Century will be all about; to learn what it takes to build a strong club in the 21st Century; and to have some fun and fellowship while learning from & sharing with your peers around the State.

When you come to Midland you can actually take part in one of **3 Action Projects** designed to give the participants classroom instruction & then hands on experience, while participating in a live local project. You can learn how to set up and screen children's eyes & get certified with the modern Plus Optix and Spot machines; or you can learn how to set up an adult eye screening and place recycled glasses on those in need; or how about building a handicap ramp for someone local with a proven system & ADA compliant blueprints that can be replicated in your own home town. Bring several members, so you can learn about all 3. **There is a special pre-registration for these projects (go to www.texaslions.org for all registration forms including the Action Projects).**

When you come to Midland, you can participate in crowning the 1st "**Lions Feeding Frenzy**" Charity tasting contest champion (Thursday Evening), while enjoying entrees & deserts donated by local restaurants. The convention will make cash donations (up to \$10/registrant) to TLC, TLERC, TLF, and others based on charity dollars you will be given in your packets. There will also be a social hour on us with beer, wine, chips, salsa, and soft drinks; as well as music, dancing, and a special presentation from the Midland Community Theater's world-renown "Summer Mummies". Come enjoy the fun!

When you come to Midland, you will hear a fantastic Lion and awarding winning Nashville singer & songwriter, Karen Taylor-Good, entertain us with her inspirational songs of service. We are sure to hear some selections from her Lions Album about service and likely, as rumor has it, she will have a new song just for us Texas Lions. Rumor also has it she will do a duet with a currently unnamed Past International President, who is also a singer & songwriter in his own right.

When you come to Midland, you can participate in **seminars** about rebuilding your club, what campus clubs could mean to your own Lions Club; how to help in the Prevention of Child Abuse; how to get into the Rock and Roll Cycles program for the handicapped kids in your community; being a District Leader; and even special programs on LCIF & "Strengthening the Pride" by our Immediate Past International President & current Chairman of LCIF, Lion Joe Preston. You might also listen in as our leaders of tomorrow participate for scholarships in our Opportunity for Youth Contests. On Saturday we will be opening up to the public, a special diabetes seminar for part-time care givers and also a special TLC seminar. What a great way for the public to see what we Lions are about.

When you come to Midland, you will hear what the **Texas Lions Camp** has meant to a camper's life, some 50 years later, and you will hear **Helen Keller** (as portrayed by actress Mollie Milligan) give her famous speech to Lions. You will be able to play in the **golf** tournament, go on 4 **great excursions** to see some of Midland's best attractions; and for all you young family Lions – **When you come to Midland** if you have young children we will have **child care** for all of the major seminars & events **(must pre-register)**.

Best of ALL, when you come to Midland, you will be welcomed by the A#1 Lions of Texas, home District of Past International president Lion Ebb Grindstaff. **Sadly what you can't do when you come to Midland** is all of the above, **UNLESS** you bring several of your members to cover it all!

Why Partner with Prevent Child Abuse?

Lions Clubs International was founded upon the concept of service to our communities. To this day a major focus is service that helps children in some way. In Texas our shining example of course is the Texas Lions Camp. Lions throughout the state also serve youth by providing glasses, medical care, diabetes awareness, and fun activities for children like “beep Easter Egg hunts”. On a world-wide effort we help control or eradicate measles and river blindness through distribution of medicine. The key though is “We Serve”. As I have visited clubs, the single driving force to attract and retain members is that of service. Last year, IP Joe Preston challenged us to “Strengthen the Pride (Lions) through service”. I firmly believe that by identifying areas of need within their area, clubs offer opportunities for men and women to join in service through membership in local Lions Clubs.

So let’s look at one area within our state that clubs could “Strengthen our Pride”. Back in the early 1970’s my wife (Pat) and I were foster parents for 3 years. Children were placed in our home in that period from anywhere to 2 days to 2 ½ years. They came from homes that under any definition were ones of child neglect or abuse. Prevent Child Abuse Texas (PCATX) is a statewide non-profit organization working to prevent child abuse and neglect in all its forms throughout Texas.

The 2015-16 Council of Governors has moved to partner with PCATX by requesting each club in Texas to have an event, a program or a project that supports the goal of PCATX to prevent child abuse and neglect in all its forms throughout Texas in the month of April 2016. Going back to my belief of service leads to membership growth, I would recommend that clubs use these events to publicize their clubs and provide information for membership. The Council will be working to get statewide publicity for Lions in partnership with PCATX.

Serve first, but also let people know what you do and why you serve. Then offer membership in Lions for others also interested in serving. Why partner? It’s a win-win for all of us!
