## **Lions Eye Health Program**

Our Lions Eye Health Program was front center and enhanced at the cabinet meeting. Lion Rose Ann Barajas, District Diabetes Chairperson, reviewed new research on diabetes that she recently published. The research examined the prevalence of diabetes among young children here in South Texas and emphasized the damage that this disease causes to our eyes. Lion Wally Jackson, chairperson of our Lions Sight Research Foundation board and LSRF COO, PDG Sam Pantusa followed her. They announced a grant opportunity from the Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) proposed by LSRF and our partners at the University of Texas Health Science Center in San Antonio. The grant would expand the vision screening services offered by the Lion Gene Eberlin Clinical Imaging Laboratory and will directly benefit south Texas children. It was extremely gratifying to see our district delegates unanimously approve the grant application. We're looking forward to a positive response from LCIF and greater service to young people at risk of losing their vision.

27 July 2019 District 2-A2 Lions from the San Antonio Westside Lion's Club conducted vision screenings at the Catholic Charities Health Fair. The event took place at the Guadalupe Community Center at 1801 Cesar Chavez Blvd. Adults were given a visual acuity screening. Children three to twelve years old were screened using the Plusoptix Camera. A total of Eighty-four persons took advantage of the vision screenings. Of the Forty-five adults screened, twenty-nine were referred for further examination by an eye doctor. Thirty-nine children were screened and ten were referred for further evaluation by an eye doctor. Lion volunteers for the event were: Steven Medina - Club President, Rose Mary Paletta - Club Vice President, Jeanette Medina - Club Chaplain, Chris LLOYD - Mobile Eye Screening Unit (MESU) coordinator, Lion George Prado - Club Tail Twister, Nick Garcia - Club Marketing Director and his wife Angie C. Garcia. The seven Lions contributed four hours each for a total of twenty-eight volunteer hours. Value to the community is estimated at \$1400.00 based on \$50 per screening.



## With a Little Help from Our Friends



On June 19<sup>th</sup>, 2019, The Laredo Noon Host Lions Club, Bright Sight support group and HHSC Blind Children's Services, Co-Sponsored an Audio Descriptive movie day at the Alamo Draft House in Laredo, Texas. The group was treated to a first run movie *The Secret Life of Pets 2*.
