I hope that you and your club had a fabulous September and survived all of the record setting heat we've had lately. We had several auspicious events including the Harvest Moon on Friday the 13th, the autumnal equinox on September 23<sup>rd</sup> and many zone meetings. And lest we forget, as of October 1 there are only 85 shopping days until Christmas.

### **Lions Eye Health Program/Stride for Sight**

Our District 2-A2 Lions Sight Research Foundation is stepping up its service by planning for a Casino Night Fundraiser on Saturday evening March 14, 2020 to benefit our Lions Eye Health projects. See the ubiquitous flyers or our online District 2-A2 calendar for details.

This month I want to share another great article on health from *HealthDay*. The title is: ***Every Minute of Exercise Counts When It Comes to Longevity*** by Robert Preidt.

In the study, the team analyzed data from more than 36,000 adults, aged 40 and older, who were followed for an average of almost six years.

### **Any physical activity helps**

During follow-up, nearly 6% of the participants died. After adjusting for other factors, the *researchers concluded that any amount of physical activity, regardless of intensity, was associated with a significantly lower risk of early death.*

Death rates fell sharply as total activity increased to an amount that was similar to average activity levels in U.S. men and about 10% to 15% lower than activity levels in

Scandinavian men and women, the findings showed.

A similarly steep decline in death rates was associated with increasing amounts of light physical activity up to about 300 minutes (5 hours) a day, and moderate-intensity physical activity of about 24 minutes per day.

The largest difference in early death risk (about 60% to 70%) was between the least and most physically active, with about five times more deaths among inactive people than among those who were most active, according to the report.

### **Too much sitting raises risk of early death**

The researchers also found that spending 9.5 hours or more each day sitting was associated with a statistically significant increased risk of early death.

The report was published Aug. 21 in the *BMJ*.

*The findings add to evidence that any amount of physical activity -- whether light, moderate or high-intensity -- is beneficial and likely achievable for many people, according to Ulf Ekelund, a professor at the Norwegian School of Sport Sciences in Oslo, and colleagues.*

### **Activity that counts**

Examples of light-intensity activity include slow walking or household tasks, such as cooking or washing dishes. Moderate activity includes brisk walking, vacuuming or mowing the lawn, while vigorous activity includes jogging, carrying heavy loads or digging.

Guidelines recommend at least 150 minutes of moderate intensity or 75 minutes of vigorous physical activity each week, but the amount and intensity of activity needed to protect health has been unclear.

These findings provide important information for public health recommendations and suggest that the message might simply be "**sit less and move more, and more often,**" the researchers said in a journal news release.

## Stepping Up Our Service

August 31, 2019

District 2-A2 Lions from Lions Club International participated in the LION'S DAY at MILBERGER'S landscape and nursery. The Lions Sight Research Foundation Mobile Eye Screening Unit provided visual acuity, glaucoma intra-ocular pressure screening and for adults over fifty, field of vision screening. Kids twelve and under were screened using the Plus Optics camera. A total of forty-one participants signed up. Among the twenty-eight adults, four failed far vision testing, seven failed near vision testing. They were referred for further evaluation by an eye doctor. Four diabetics were screened. Of the thirteen kids screened one was referred for further evaluation. Eight Lions from District 2-A2 volunteered five hours each (forty hours). The Lions volunteering were Lion Debbie Book District Twenty Lions; Lion PDG Chris Lloyd; Lions Nick and Angie Garcia, Ernesto Castro, Rose Mary Palleta from the West Side Lion's Club; Lion Norm from Alamo Heights Lions; Lion Wally from Northwest Lions Club. Based on the figure of Fifty Dollars per screening, the value provided to the community was \$2050. Special thanks to the owners and staff of Milberger's Nursery for hosting us for this event.

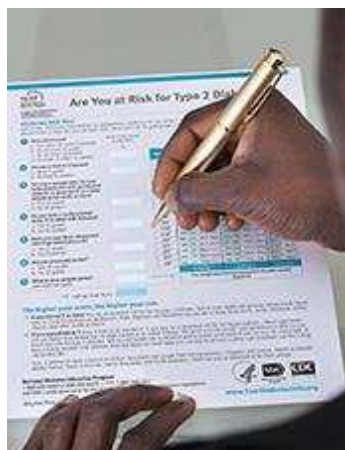

The sooner your community knows they're at risk, the sooner they can take steps to prevent or manage diabetes.



Diabetes affects millions of children and adults around the world. The South Texas region suffers from twice the national average of diagnosed Type 2 Diabetes and claims the youngest Type 2 Diabetes in child in the world. And with our continued support of the Texas Lions Camp, we see the impact Type 1 diabetes has on our children.

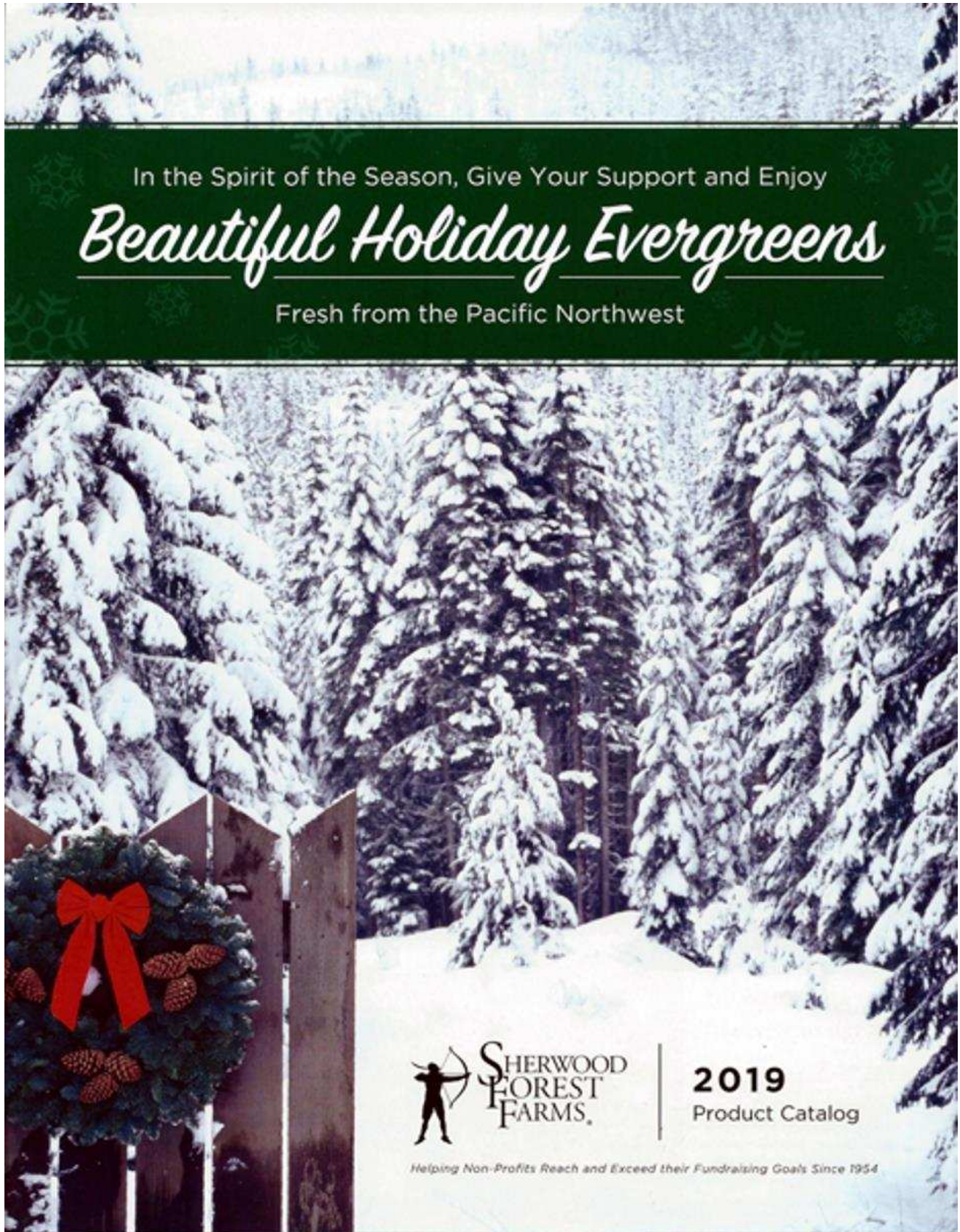

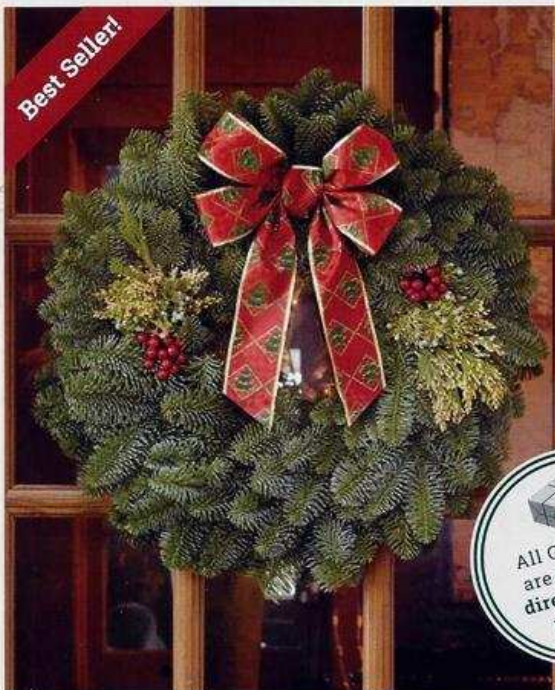
