The District Convention is fast approaching. It will be held at the Inn of the Hills Resort, 1001 Junction Hwy, Kerrville, Texas on April 4, 2020. There will be a Friday night social at the Inn of the Hills beginning at 6:00 p.m. On Saturday, April 4, 2020, will be our convention meeting and the Opportunities for Youth Contest. Our guest speaker for the Saturday evening banquet is Past International Director, Gary Anderson from Grand Rapids, Michigan.

Voting will be on Saturday, April 4, 2020. I have emailed all club Presidents and Secretaries the Constitution and By-laws for the Human Needs Board, Lions Children Services of District 2-A2 and the District Constitution and By-laws. I have also emailed the Texas Lions Camp Director Resolution, LSRF Board of Directors and Human Needs Board of Directors Resolutions and the different increase and decrease of dues Resolutions. As you can see, there is a lot that needs to be voted on at the District Convention. I have not yet received information from LCI on how many delegates your club will have. As soon as I get that information, I will email your club President and Secretary. Your club Secretary can also go on to MyLion and register your delegates for the District Convention, you will still need to send PDG Cal your delegates and alternates information. For your club to be eligible to vote, your LCI dues and your District dues must be paid 30 days before the convention. There are still openings on the Lion Sight Research Foundation Board and the Human Needs Board. If you are interested in a position on the Human Needs Board or Lions Sight Research Foundation, you must submit your Resolution to Lion Nancy Hosek at [nhosek1@felpsis.net](mailto:nhosek1@felpsis.net) and to me at [jgarza070@gmail.com](mailto:jgarza070@gmail.com). The deadline to submit your resolution is **March 3, 2020**. No resolutions will be accepted after this date. Don't forget to purchase an ad for your Board Candidates in the Convention Book. You can also purchase an ad for your club. The monies collected for the Convention Book ads goes toward the Opportunities for Youth Scholarships.

There is still time to enter a student in the Opportunities for Youth Contests. The Contest will be held on April 4, 2020 at the District Convention at the Inn of the Hills Resort in Kerrville. The deadline for applications and ad sales is **March 15, 2020**. The applications along with the essays need to be mailed or emailed to the contest Coordinators. All ad sales along with payment must be mailed to **Lion Abel Martinez, 412 San Manuel, San Antonio, Texas 78237**. Please read the contest rules carefully along with the Clubs responsibilities. If your club would like to sponsor one of the 4 Youth Contest Scholarships, contact Lion Abel and Lion Steve Mays (District Treasurer). The cost for the 1<sup>st</sup> Place Scholarship is \$1000.00 and \$500.00 for the 2<sup>nd</sup> Place Scholarship; per each of the contests. If your club sponsors a 1<sup>st</sup> place contest scholarship, your club will receive a complimentary full-page ad in the convention booklet. If your club sponsors a 2<sup>nd</sup> place contest scholarship, your club will receive a complimentary half-page ad in the convention booklet. You will need to send your ad to Lion Abel as well. You need to mention that your club is sponsoring a 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> Place Scholarship and which contest you will be sponsoring.

You can find information about the District Convention and register online. The early registration deadline for the Convention is March 11, 2020. No registrations will be accepted after March 31, 2020. Hotel registration deadline is March 11, 2020. If your club has an event, please go to our website and enter your event under the Calendar tab. Do not forget to enter your service projects on MyLion. If you are still having trouble entering information, do not hesitate to contact me. I will try and walk you through the process.

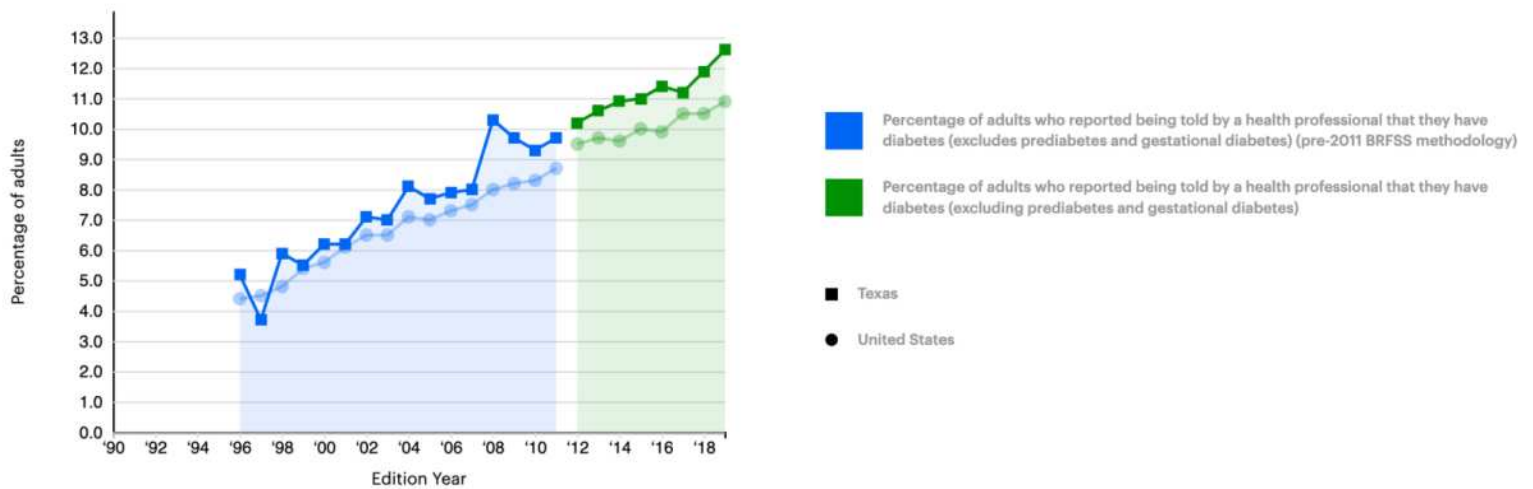
Here's some interesting information from America's Health Rankings

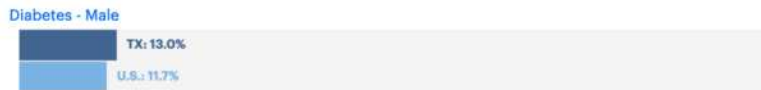
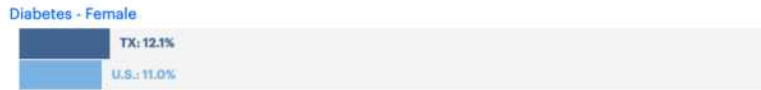
Here are two charts that compare the incidence of diabetes over time in the United States as a whole and Texas. Diabetes is becoming more prevalent year after year and, unfortunately, Texas has higher rates than our nation as a whole.



The second set of bar graphs shows comparisons of different parts of US and Texas populations and their respective rates of diabetes. Again, in most categories Texans have higher rates of diabetes than the rest of the United States.

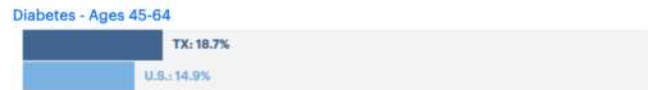
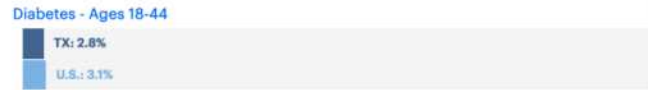
**Subpopulations: Diabetes, Texas, United States**

**GENDER**



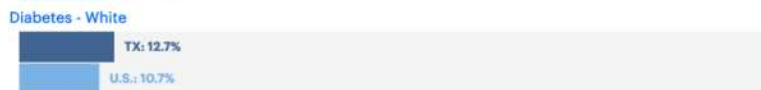
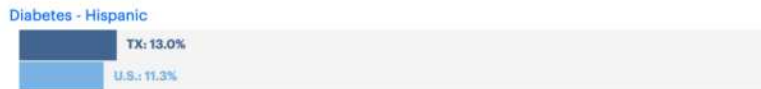
Percentage of adults

**AGE**



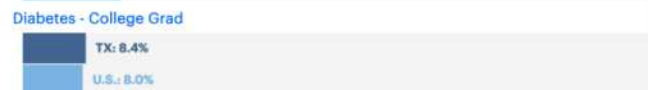
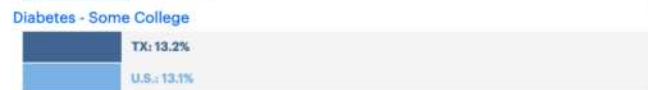
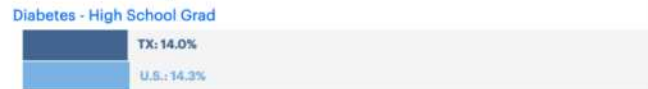
Percentage of adults

Texas ranks 3th out of 50 in the overall health ranking. Here are the highlights for 2019:

**Strengths**

- High percentage of high school graduation
- Low prevalence of smoking
- Low drug death rate

**Challenges**

- High percentage of uninsured population
- Low rate of mental health providers
- **High prevalence of diabetes**

**Highlights**

- Since 2012, obesity increased 14% from 30.4% to 34.8% of adults
- Since 2007, drug deaths increased 24% from 8.3 to 10.3 deaths per 100,000 population

- In the past year, violent crime decreased 6% from 439 to 411 offenses per 100,000 population, and has decreased 51% since peaking in 1993
- In the past two years, mental health providers increased 14% from 98.3 to 111.8 per 100,000 population
- **In the past year, diabetes increased 6% from 11.9% to 12.6% of adults**
- Since 1993, low birthweight increased 22% from 6.9% to 8.4% of live births

Dear fellow Lions,

Texas Lions Camp is 70 years old (that is hard to believe) and is beginning to show signs of its age. TLC has a large Board of Directors consisting of 94 voting members and over 300 volunteers that serve on one of 10 standing committees (audit; by-laws; camp improvements; camp program; development; finance; funds,vestments & investments; historical; planned giving & endowment; and public relations;). As a corporation TLC has has more than 200 full-time and seasonal employees (who are organized into 7 departments) and over 2,000 volunteers per year that are

responsible for creating an atmosphere of success for more than 1500 children with disabilities each summer.

Stephen Mabry, President and CEO of TLC, is a Certified Association Executive with the American Society of Association Executives, a past Certified Fund-Raising Executive with the Association of Fund-Raising Professionals. Stephen is the father of three and he resides along with his wife on the TLC campus.

Under Stephen's very capable leadership and after a master architectural plan and a feasibility study for funding those plans had been accomplished Stephen asked the Board to adopt and allow the launch of Phase I of the campaign to go forward. After hearing the reports from the study the Board enthusiastically voted to proceed and TLC is now officially operating the Capital CAMPAign known as Vision 2020 & Beyond.

This is an exciting time for TLC. Our founders under the leadership of then District Governor Jack Wiech likely had no idea what they had set in motion with their vision for TLC or even **IF** it would work. Reading that history is very interesting. Despite the uncertainty of success, Lions dared to dream. As a result, here we are 70 years later having served 80,000 children and the model and mission has been pressured-tested and proven successful.

70 years has taken its toll on our facilities. We need to replace our aging bunkhouses with new, accessible facilities. Go to [lionscamp.com/Get Involved/Master Plan](http://lionscamp.com/Get Involved/Master Plan) and see plans for our new bunkhouses. Take a look at the whole Master Plan. It is a little dated but you can see the dream. It is exciting to see what lays in store as we develop 4 camping areas that will take us into the next generation of TLC's service to our children.

A lot of thought and planning has gone into CAMPAign Vision 2020 and Beyond. As we approach the 75th anniversary of the camp it is great to make the dream a reality for more special needs kids.

## District 2A2 Lions Clubs

Forty one persons were screened for vision acuity, ten failed Far Vision and nineteen failed Near Vision and were referred for further evaluation by physician. 41 persons were screened for glaucoma/eye pressure, A visual field exam was conducted on one individual. Three Lions staffed the MESU Unit, PDG Lion Christopher Lloyd (MESU Manager), Lions Nick and Angie Garcia from San Antonio Westside Lions Club. Five students from See International also volunteered their time.



February 28, 2020 Lions from District 2A2 conducted free visual screenings at the Harlendale's What's Next Symposium - Special Olympics. Welch Allyn SPOT cameras were used to accomplish the examinations. Lions volunteering to staff this event were: Lion Ken Book and his wife Debbie from Region 20 Lion's Club; 2A2 District Governor Lion Janie Garza; Lion Rose Mary Paleta; Lion Nick Garcia and his wife Angie from the San Antonio West Side Lion's Club. A total of twenty four volunteer hours were accumulated by the Lions. 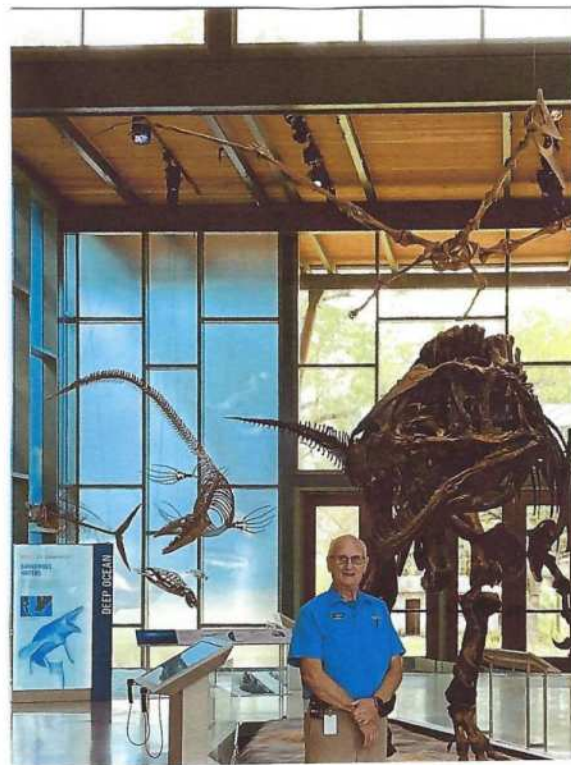
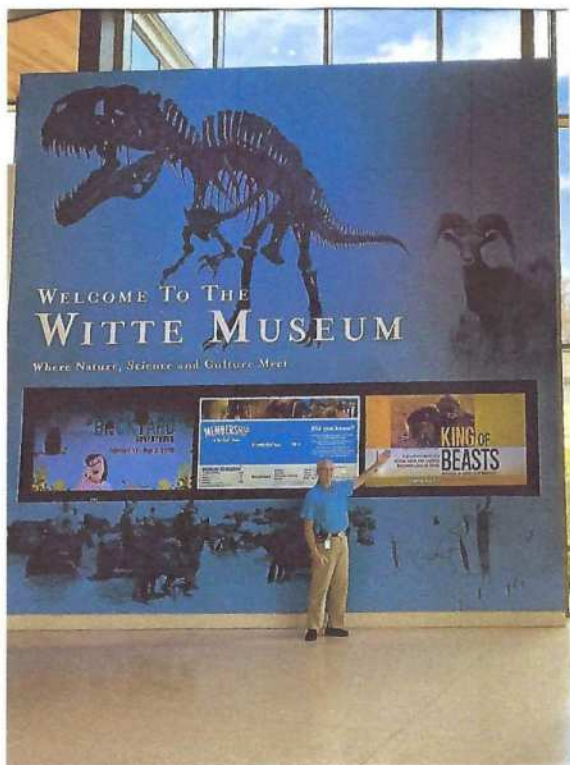
## Alamo Heights Lions Club
